Genesis 3:1-10

Revelation 20:2

III. We discovered alienation. (7-10)

Native to us (Paradise lost):

Blessing > Curse (Curse has replaced blessing)

Perfection > Imperfection (Imperfection has taken the place of perfection)

Purpose > Futility (Futility has triumphed over purpose)

Provision > Poverty (Instead of provision, we face poverty)

Connection > Division (Instead of connection, we have division)

Peace > Fear (And most of all, in the place of peace, we know fear)
