HI: Jesus is better.
Title: Profit & Loss
Hook: P&L Statement

Purpose: To juxtapose the worthlessness of self-righteousness with the

pricelessness of knowing Christ.

FCF: Like the Philippians, all sinners naturally desire and futilely attempt to be made right. God's grace meets us in Jesus, who brings a righteousness to sinners that cannot be attained through any source but him.

COR: There are innumerable sources which advertise that we can be made right by jumping through various hoops. Only Christ brings us a righteousness we need not earn, because we cannot attain it without him.

Witness of Christ [WC*]: The death, resurrection, and glorification of Christ is seen in vv. 10-11; showing how the sinner is made right.

Apologetic: Believe in yourself vs. Gospel (end of MVM 2)

Main Idea:

Subject: Why is knowing Jesus a source of joy to Paul and the Philippians? Complement: Because in Christ sinners receive a righteousness that they cannot attain without him.

Exegetical Idea: Knowing Jesus is a source of joy to Paul and the Philippians because in Christ sinners receive a righteousness from God that they cannot attain without him.

Theological Idea: Knowing Christ brings joy because in him sinners receive a righteousness they cannot attain on their own.

Homiletical Idea: Jesus is better.

Introduction:

READ Philippians 3:1-11

Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you is no trouble to me and is safe for you. 2 Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh. 3 For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh— 4 though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. False religion = Jesus[plus]

Circumcision: "chosen recipients of God's promises"

No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for God's seed abides in him; and he cannot keep on sinning, because he has been born of God. 1 John 3:9

Flesh = [minus]Jesus

B. Knowing Christ is priceless. (4-8)

HI: Jesus is better.
