<sup>1</sup> By the waters of Babylon, there we sat down and wept, when we remembered Zion. <sup>2</sup> On the willows[<sup>a</sup>] there

we hung up our lyres. <sup>3</sup> For there our captors

required of us songs,

and our tormentors, mirth, saying,

"Sing us one of the songs of Zion!"

How shall we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?

<sup>5</sup> If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget its skill!

<sup>6</sup> Let my tongue stick to the roof of my mouth, if I do not remember you,

if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy!

<sup>7</sup> Remember, O Lord, against the Edomites the day of Jerusalem,

how they said, "Lay it bare, lay it bare, down to its foundations!"

- <sup>9</sup> Blessed shall he be who takes your little ones and dashes them against the rock!
