The Church Needs Servants

- o Servant Leaders (Elders, Pastors, Overseers) Verses 1-7
- o Leading Servants (Deacons) Verses 8-12

Only Difference Between Pastors and Deacons:

Pastor - ² Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach

Deacon - ⁹They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience.

Pastors serve as they lead The Church through the teaching of the Word

Deacons lead as they serve The Church to uphold what is being taught
