Call To Worship

Leader: Scripture provides a roadmap for us to not just start well but finish well. When we sin, we should confess our wrongdoings to God and avoid walking after the flesh. In obedience and with conviction, let us renew our commitment to being filled with the Spirit. Gal 5:22-23; 1 John 1:9; Rom 8:1

Congregation: To avoid spiritual detours and to finish well, we need to ensure we are on the right path with clear direction. God's Word "... is a lamp for [our] feet, a light on [our] path." Psalm 119:105, Prov 3:5-6

ALL: While a clear vision keeps us moving forward; it is our trust, obedience, and intimacy with God that will strengthen our faith. When we trust, obey, and walk closely with Him, He gives us the strength to finish—not just crawling, but soaring. AMEN. Prov 29:18; Matt 9:29; Isa 40:31

Scripture Lesson: Acts 9: 1-9 (NIV)

Leader: 1 Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest 2 and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem.

Congregation: 3 As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. 4 He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?"

Leader: 5 "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. 6 "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

Congregation: 7 The men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone.

ALL: 8 Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus. 9 For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything. AMEN.

"FINISHING WELL."



Pastor: 1 Cor. 11:23 (KJV)

For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread:

1 Cor 11:24 (NLT) 24 and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Congregation: John 6:35 (KJV)

And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.

Pastor: 1 Cor. 11:25 (KJV)

After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.
