KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Paul's reason for arguing for election and reprobation is because it appears God's promises have failed since most Israelites have rejected the gospel.
- God is just in electing some to be saved because He can give mercy to whoever He wants.
- God predestines with a purpose—some receive God's wrath on sin, others receive His mercy.
- Our response must be thanking God for saving us and never stop giving the gospel to others.



TALK ABOUT IT

2. What parts of election and reprobation give you comfort? What parts give you worry or concern?
3. How would you answer the questions that Paul asks in this passage?
 - a. Is God unjust or unfair?
 - b. Why can God still find fault if someone is predestined?



APPLY IT
