

Study Guide: Big Moves | Divine Execution

Lesson Summary & Objective

This lesson teaches that God is the ultimate Planner, and believers are called to follow Him through faith-filled obedience. While God reveals His plan, He unfolds its fulfillment through progressive steps. The objective is to help participants understand how Scripture, the Holy Spirit, and obedience work together to reveal the next steps in God's plan.

Lesson Points & Discussion

- God Has a Plan, and Steps Fulfill It (Jeremiah 29:11)

God's plan exists before our lives unfold, but fulfillment comes through daily obedience rather than instant arrival.

- Why is it easier to celebrate God's promises than to embrace His process?
- What helps you stay faithful when progress feels slow?

- The Plan Is Not the Process (Isaiah 9:6–7)

God may reveal the destination clearly while allowing the journey to develop faith through surrender and obedience.

- How does Jesus' life illustrate the difference between promise and process?
- Why do you think God often withholds details of the process?

- Following the Steps in the Word (Luke 4:17; Matthew 4:4)

Jesus modeled obedience by locating Himself in Scripture and aligning His actions with God's Word.

- What does it mean to 'find yourself' in Scripture?
- How can Scripture guide decisions when emotions are unclear?

- Hidden Wisdom Revealed by the Spirit (1 Corinthians 2:6–10)

God reveals His hidden wisdom and steps through the Holy Spirit, beyond natural reasoning.

- Why is spiritual discernment necessary for following God's steps?
- How do prayer and listening help reveal God's direction?

- The Word Reveals the Next Step (Psalm 119:105)

God's Word provides guidance for the next step rather than the full journey, building faith progressively.

- Why does God emphasize the next step instead of the whole plan?
- How does obedience bring clarity?

- Faith Steps Lead to Growth (2 Peter 1:3–4; Romans 8:29)

Each step of faith shapes character and conforms believers into Christlikeness.

- How have past steps of obedience shaped your faith?
- Why is spiritual maturity more important than speed?

- Faith Is Activated by Obedience (Romans 10:17; James 1:22)

Faith grows through hearing and responding to God's Word, not passive listening.

- What practical steps help you move from hearing to doing?

- What step of obedience may God be prompting you to take now?
