Our Vision: To see the city of Seattle look more and more like the city of God.

A little over 2,000 years ago, Jesus of Nazareth was born in a relatively obscure corner of the world. As he became an adult, he began to call people to follow him wherever he might lead them.

He healed their diseases, forgave their sins, cast out evil spirits that were tormenting them, and powerfully taught them the word and ways of God. Notably, Jesus had the holy audacity to encourage ordinary people like us to approach and relate to God as a loving parent.

Liturgical Colors: Liturgical colors can orient us to the season of the church year and help to engage our sense of sight in worship.

Green is the color for Ordinary Time, symbolizing the hope of new life which is ours in the life of Jesus Christ.

The small symbols you will see throughout these pages correspond to a "Key to Liturgy" available here or printed and found in the lobby at the Grace Kids Table. .

The Acclamation, similar to a greeting, is a way we welcome each other into this holy space and time. It prepares us for the hearing and responding to God. Our liturgy can be thought of as a conversation between each other and God. Conversations require both hearing a responding. The Acclamation prepares us for the hearing and responding to God.



ORDINARY TIME: TRUST IN THE SLOW WORK OF GOD

Ordinary Time extends from Pentecost to Advent. It is the longest season of the church calendar. The name "ordinary" is derived from the historical practice of numbering (i.e., ordering) the Sundays during this time period.

The liturgical color for this season is green. This gives us a great clue on how we might hold Ordinary Time.

Green symbolizes growth. Through the power of the Holy Spirit–poured out at Pentecost–we can now grow in our lives with God. This growth–what the Bible refers to as the "Fruit of the Spirit"–is beautiful and organic, as God grows us from the inside out. But, like a field full of crops, our growth in Christ takes a long time. This reality should give us hope as well as kindness towards ourselves as we cooperate with the Spirit.

THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

- Almighty God,
 - to you all hearts are open,

Praise To The Lord The Almighty

- all desires known,
- and from you no secrets are hid:
- Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts
 - by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A collect is a prayer that is intended to collect or sum up the prayers of the community, typically following a four-fold pattern: invocation, meditation, petition, and doxology. The Collect for Purity helps us to hear God's word and worship by reminding us that we are laid bare when we come before him. He sees and knows all that we are and all that we bring to him. We come to God that we might be shaped and formed by his Word.



"Lectio Sacra" means "sacred reading." It has been the practice of the church for thousands of years to have portions of the bible read during worship services. The assumption behind this practice is that we are people who need to be shaped by all of God's word.

LECTIO SACRA

Old Testament Reading

1 Kings 3:3-14

Solomon showed his love for the Lord by walking according to the instructions given him by his father David, except that he offered sacrifices and burned incense on the high places.

The king went to Gibeon to offer sacrifices, for that was the most important high place, and Solomon offered a thousand burnt offerings on that altar. At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon during the night in a dream, and God said, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you."

Solomon answered, "You have shown great kindness to your servant, my father David, because he was faithful to you and righteous and upright in heart. You have continued this great kindness to him and have given him a son to sit on his throne this very day.

"Now, Lord my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David. But I am only a little child and do not know how to carry out my duties. Your servant is here among the people you have chosen, a great people, too numerous to count or number. So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours?"

The Lord was pleased that Solomon had asked for this. So God said to him, "Since you have asked for this and not for long life or wealth for yourself, nor have asked for the death of your enemies but for discernment in administering justice, I will do what you have asked. I will give you a wise and discerning heart, so that there will never have been anyone like you, nor will there ever be. Moreover, I will give you what you have not asked for-both wealth and honor-so that in your lifetime you will have no equal among kings. And if you walk in obedience to me and keep my decrees and commands as David your father did, I will give you a long life."

New Testament Reading

Romans 8:26-34

In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us allhow will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who diedmore than that, who was raised to life-is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.

This is the word of the Lord, **Thanks be to God!**

INTERLUDE

PRAYING THE PSALMS Psalm 119:121-136 I have done what is righteous and just; do not leave me to my oppressors. Ensure your servant's well-being; do not let the arrogant oppress me. 
It is right, our duty and our joy,

The Sanctus (Latin: "Holy") is one of the songs being sung in heaven before God's throne. We join our voices to with the angels and those who have gone before us in the faith to give glory to God.

We Preach the Good News

We Draw Near (The Lord's Supper)

(All are invited to come forward during Communion. The act of receiving the bread and wine is a confession, that as you receive those gifts, you have already received the gift of a renewed relationship with God, through Christ. If that is not your confession, you may still come forward to receive a prayer. Simply cross your arms across your chest as an indication that you are coming for prayer.)

Receiving Communion

We will come forward by rows, starting at the front. There will be factory sealed communion elements as well as gluten free crackers with designated juice and wine on the table at the front. Otherwise, there is bread to dip in either wine (tall cup) or juice (short cup).

Communion Elements:

Cup: Wine or Grape Juice

Bread ingredients vary each week.

Rice Crackers: Organic Brown Rice Flour, Organic White Rice Flour

Prefilled, factory-sealed communion elements also available: Communion wafer ingredients: wheat flour, water, vegetable shortening (soybean oil, cottonseed oil).

Resources for Sunday Worship. Children are always welcome to remain in the service. An additional class along with new age groupings for each class will start in September.

- Nursing mothers' room located in the back of the Sanctuary, fit with cushioned rocking chairs and small toys for infants.
- Family room is provided in the upstairs chapel with a livestream viewing.
- Kids Activities are available in the lobby each week for use during in-person worship.
