One of the great things about the church calendar is that it appropriately extends Christian celebrations over longer periods of time than we are accustomed. For example, instead of ending our Christmas feasting after a 24-hour mad rush, the Christmas season begins on Christmas Day and extends for twelve more days—hence the song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas". It takes more than one day to marvel at the wonder of God becoming one of us in order that he might save us.

Easter is similar. In the church calendar, Easter Sunday is not all there is to Easter. Rather, it inaugurates the beginning of the 7-week Easter season, which extends all the way until Pentecost Sunday on May 20th.

This is formative for us because the resurrection isn't just something we celebrate for a day and then afterwards return back to our lives as they were before. Instead, the resurrection life that Jesus shares with his people has its beginning on Easter Sunday. From there forward, it stretches out into eternity. After the resurrection, life is never the same again.

In other words, Easter is to become a new way of life for us. We need lots of reminders and lots of practice living into this new reality—one day won't do it justice. Hence, Easter becomes a 49-day period in the life of the church each year.

In this way, the season of Easter is a great gift to us. It helps us to practice and live out the truth that, in Christ, all things are being made new.

So, let us worship this morning and receive afresh the new life God has given to us through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead!

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!

LECTIO SACRA

Ephesians 4:17-32

Now this I say and testify in the Lord, that you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds. They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart. They have become callous and have given themselves up to sensuality, greedy to practice every kind of impurity. But that is not the way you learned Christ!— assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

INTERLUDE

On the day I called, you answered me; my strength of soul you increased.



Prayer for Receiving Communion

Lord Jesus, your perfect life, death, and resurrection are the source of all blessing in this life and the life to come. As I eat this bread and drink this cup, renew me in the joy and glory of knowing and serving you. I come to this table on the basis of your merit only and not my own. As you have completely and fully offered yourself for me, I now completely and fully offer myself to you as a living sacrifice. Amen.

The Sursum Corda (Latin: "Lift up your hearts") is an opening dialogue in the Eucharistic liturgy of the Christian Church and dates back (at least) to the third century. This text encourages the church to come with thankfulness and joy to the Lord's table.

THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

Communion, also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is the family meal of Christians. We invite all baptized followers of Jesus Christ who acknowledge their sins against God and their neighbors and confess their need for the grace of Christ to partake of this meal. If you are a Christian and haven't been baptized, please talk with one of our pastors. We would be honored to baptize you. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with his people, the church.

If you would like prayer during communion, intercessors will be available at the front of the sanctuary to pray with you.



Luke 9:1-9
