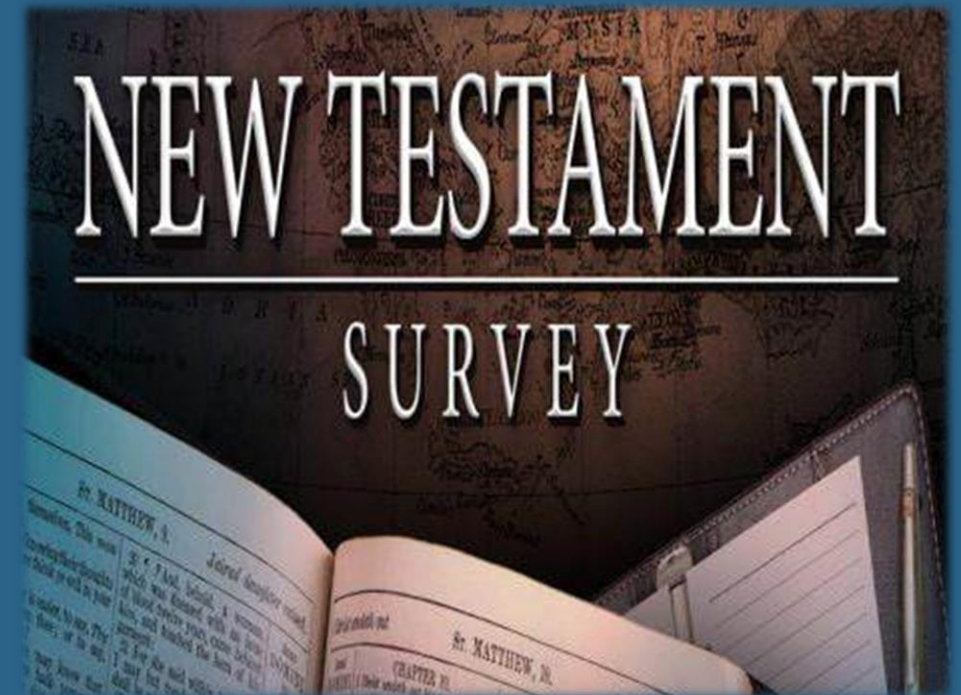

Step 1: GET REAL

Step 2: GET FED

Philippians Chapter 1 – (1:3-6, 9-11, 18-21, 27-28)

Why did Paul thank God for the Philippians?

What was Paul sure of regarding God and the Philippians?

-How could he be sure of this? What does this assurance mean to us?

What did Paul want the Philippians to abound in? Why?

-Do we abound in this? What is the result of this for God?

Why was Paul able to rejoice?

What did Paul consider his life/his death? How could he have this attitude?

How were the Philippians to stand firm?

-What was their attitude to be toward their opponents?

- Are we frightened by our opponents? How can we overcome this?

Step 2: GET FED

Philippians Chapter 2 – (2:3-7, 14-16)

How are we to think about others?

-Who is the example of this?

-What is society's example/recommendation in this arena?

-How am I doing in this respect?

How are we to do all things?

-How hard is this to do?

-How often do we grumble or dispute?

-What is the impact of this?

Step 2: GET FED

Philippians Chapter 3 – (3:8-14)

Why did Paul count his losses as rubbish?

What was the one thing Paul wanted to know? Why?

Why did Paul press on?

What does it mean to press on? – Is it active or passive?

“Forgetting what lies behind”

-How hard is this for us to do?

-Are we haunted by our sins and unable to accept forgiveness and move on?

Step 2: GET FED

Philippians Chapter 4 – (4:4-8, 11-19)

What does it mean to rejoice in the Lord?

-How often do we rejoice in the Lord?

Anxiety is rampant in our society, what is Paul's solution?

-Have you tried this?

How often do we combine prayer with thanksgiving?

Have you experienced the peace of God?

What percentage of our thoughts fit into the categories of verse 8?

-Into what other categories do our thoughts fit?

Does contentment characterize my life?

Where does my strength come from? How often do I depend on myself/others?

Step 3: GET ACTIVE

Increase our knowledge and discernment so our love may abound.

Evaluate carefully your attitude toward others and yourself and compare it to 2:3-7.

Write down the categories of thoughts in 4:8. Try to think in each category each day this week.
