1 John 1:5 (RSV) we read, "This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him is no darkness at all."

Jesus in his sermon on the mount taught, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in Heaven." (Matthew 5:16 RSV)
