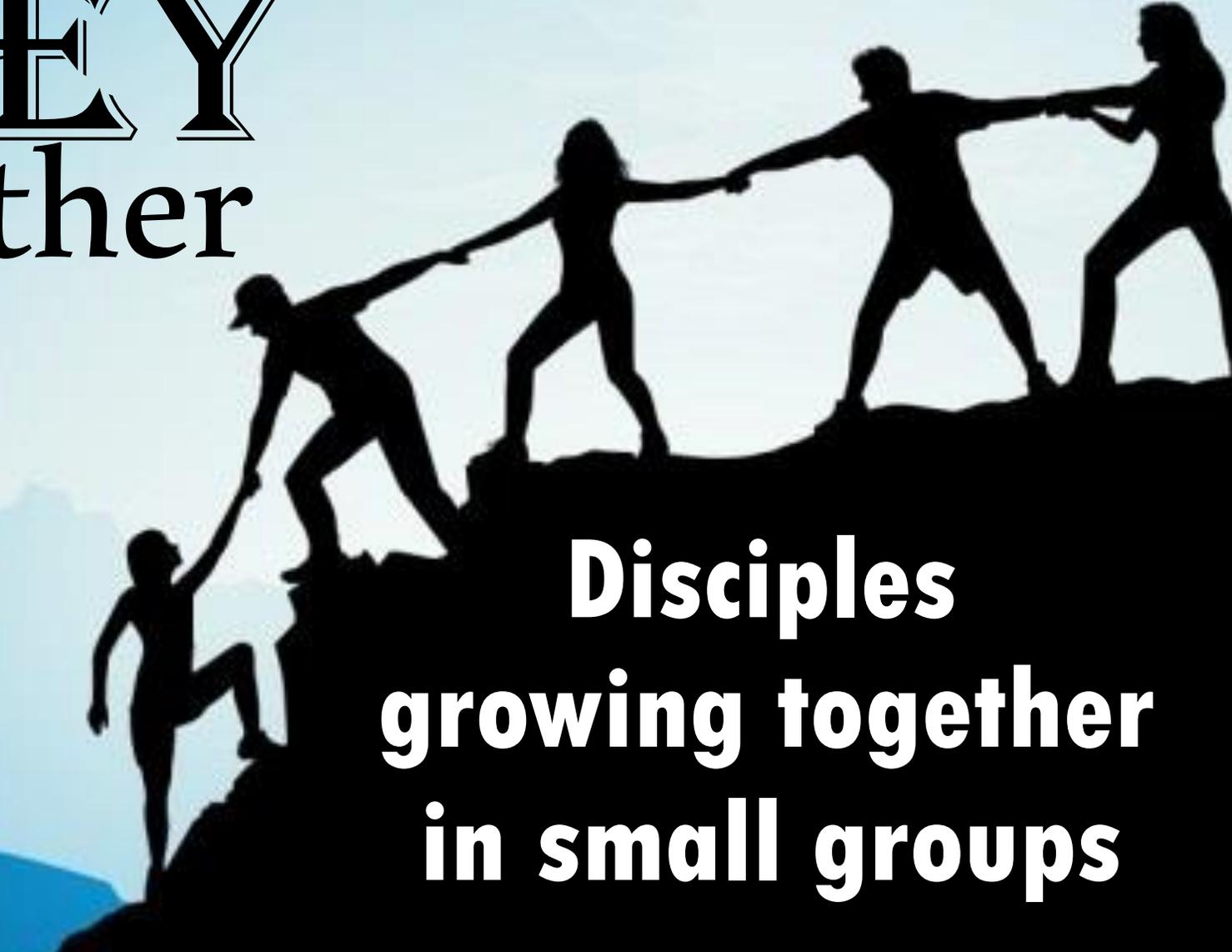



# Step 2: GET FED

What is Christ's correspondence to angels?

What significance should these answers hold for Christians?

What do God's and Christ's eternity mean for us?

# Step 2: GET FED

Why should we pay close attention to the word?

How will we act if we believe this?

# Step 3: GET ACTIVE
