A Brief History of the Lessons & Carols Service

The Lessons & Carols service began at King's College, Cambridge, England on Christmas Eve 1918 to bring a more imaginative approach to worship. 1918 was the final year for the First World War, a time of hopelessness and fatigue. The hope surrounding the message of Christ's birth was eagerly needed and well received. The service was first broadcast in 1928 and reached a worldwide audience throughout the 1930s. In 1935 Saint Thomas Church in Hanover, New Hampshire was the first church in the United States to hold their own Lessons & Carols service.

The service includes nine scripture readings ("lessons") and responsive carols to help Christians prepare and be equipped for the coming promise of Christ the Lord and Savior at Christmas. The scripture lessons read from Genesis, Isaiah, and the Gospels follow the story of the creation and fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus in nine readings.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES

The primary reason for lighting one candle the First Sunday, that candle plus another on the Second Sunday, and so on, is to signal progression. The accumulation of light reminds us of the ever closer approach of the Light of the World, both at Bethlehem and in glory at the end of the age.

Call To Worship

Please Stand.

This call to worship is based on the traditional O Antiphons which have been recited or sung in preparation for Christmas since the sixth century. Each antiphon is a title of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned and prophesied in Isaiah.

Minister: O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end of creation to the other, mightily and sweetly ordering all things,

People: Come and teach us the way of peace.

Minister: O Adonai, and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai,

People: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

Minister: O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut their mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer,

People: Come quickly to deliver us.

Minister: O Key of David and scepter of the House of Israel; you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open,

People: Come and rescue the prisoners who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Minister: O Morning Star, splendor of light eternal and sun of righteousness,

People: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Minister: O King of the nations, the ruler they long for, the cornerstone uniting all people,

People: Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

Minister: O Emmanuel, our king and our lawgiver, the hope of the nations and their Savior.

People: Come and save us, O Lord our God.

Minister: Come, Lord Jesus, come—sent forth from the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit, who, with you, live and reign, one God, now and forever.
