## **How Jesus Speaks Peace this Christmas**

### 1. JESUS SPEAKS PEACE TO MY PROBLEMS.

That evening Jesus' disciples went down to the shore to wait for him. <sup>17</sup> But as darkness fell and Jesus still hadn't come back, they got into the boat and headed across the lake toward Capernaum. <sup>18</sup> Soon a gale swept down upon them, and the sea grew very rough. <sup>19</sup> They had rowed three or four miles when suddenly they saw Jesus walking on the water toward the boat. They were terrified, <sup>20</sup> But Jesus said to them, "I AM; stop being frightened! (John 6:16–20, NLT/AMP)

"I have told you these things, so that <u>in me you may have peace</u>. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33, NIV)

#### 2. JESUS SPEAKS PEACE TO MY PAST.

"Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." (Luke 7:48–50, NIV)

#### 3. JESUS SPEAKS PEACE TO MY PAIN.

<sup>25</sup> A woman in the crowd had suffered for twelve years with constant bleeding. <sup>26</sup> She had suffered a great deal from many doctors, and over the years she had spent everything she had to pay them, but she had gotten no better. In fact, she had gotten worse. <sup>27</sup> She had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his robe. <sup>28</sup> For she thought to herself, "If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed." <sup>29</sup> Immediately the bleeding stopped, and she could feel in her body that she had been healed of her terrible condition. <sup>30</sup> Jesus realized at once that healing power had gone out from him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my robe?"

<sup>31</sup> His disciples said to him, "Look at this crowd pressing around you. How can you ask, 'Who touched me?'" <sup>32</sup> But he kept on looking around to see who had done it. <sup>33</sup> Then the frightened woman, trembling at the realization of what had happened to her, came and fell to her knees in front of him and told him what she had done. <sup>34</sup> And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. **Go in peace. Your suffering is over.**" (Mark 5:25–34, NLT)
