THE POWER OF GRATITUDE

Luke 17:11–19 (NIV)

¹¹ Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance ¹³ and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have [mercy] on us!"

¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

¹⁵ One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

¹⁷ Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

Observations of a Transformation

1. Their sickness **SEPARATED** them.

...along the border between Samaria and Galilee.

2. Their illness became their **IDENTITY**.

...ten men who had leprosy met him.

3. The UNSEEN became the SEEN.

They stood <u>at a distance</u> and called out in a loud voice...he saw them...

"Thereafter, Hagar used another name to refer to the LORD, who had spoken to her. She said, "<u>You are the God who sees me</u>." (Genesis 16:13, NLT)

4. They asked for <u>CARE</u> over a <u>CURE</u>.

Jesus, Master, have [mercy] on us!

5. They had to **BELIEVE IN ORDER TO RECEIVE**.

Go, show yourselves to the priests.

6. Nine had their skin cleansed but only one had his <u>HEART CLEANSED</u>.

"Then he said to him, "Get up. GO! <u>Your faith has healed and saved you</u>."" (Luke 17:19, The Message)

<u>One of them</u>, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? <u>Where are the other nine</u>?

Why We Don't Show Gratitude

1. We have short a <u>MEMORY</u>.

"Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything; tell God your needs, and <u>don't forget to thank him</u> for his answers." (Philippians 4:6, The Living Bible)

2. We are <u>SELF-ABSORBED</u>.

"People will be selfish, greedy, boastful, and conceited; they will be insulting, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, and irreligious;" (2 Timothy 3:2, GNB)

3. We are <u>NEXT PROBLEM</u> focused.

"...in spite of his miracles they did not trust him." (Psalm 78:32, GNB)

4. We underestimate the **IMPORTANCE** of appreciation.

Why We Should Be Grateful

1. Because gratitude is <u>GOD'S WILL</u> for believers.

"Be thankful in <u>all circumstances</u>, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NLT)

"Even though the fig trees have no blossoms, and there are no grapes on the vines; even though the olive crop fails, and the fields lie empty and barren; even though the flocks die in the fields, and the cattle barns are empty, <u>yet I will rejoice in the LORD</u>! I will be joyful in the God of my salvation!" (Habakkuk 3:17–18, NLT)

2. Because gratitude elevates WORTH.

"You must show your <u>appreciation</u> to all who serve so well." (1 Corinthians 16:18b, NLT)

3. Because gratitude is a powerful <u>WITNESS</u>.

"Do everything without complaining and arguing...shining like bright lights in a world full of crooked and perverse people." (Philippians 2:14–15, NLT)

"Good people bless and build up their city, but the wicked can destroy it with their words." (Proverbs 11:11, NCV)
