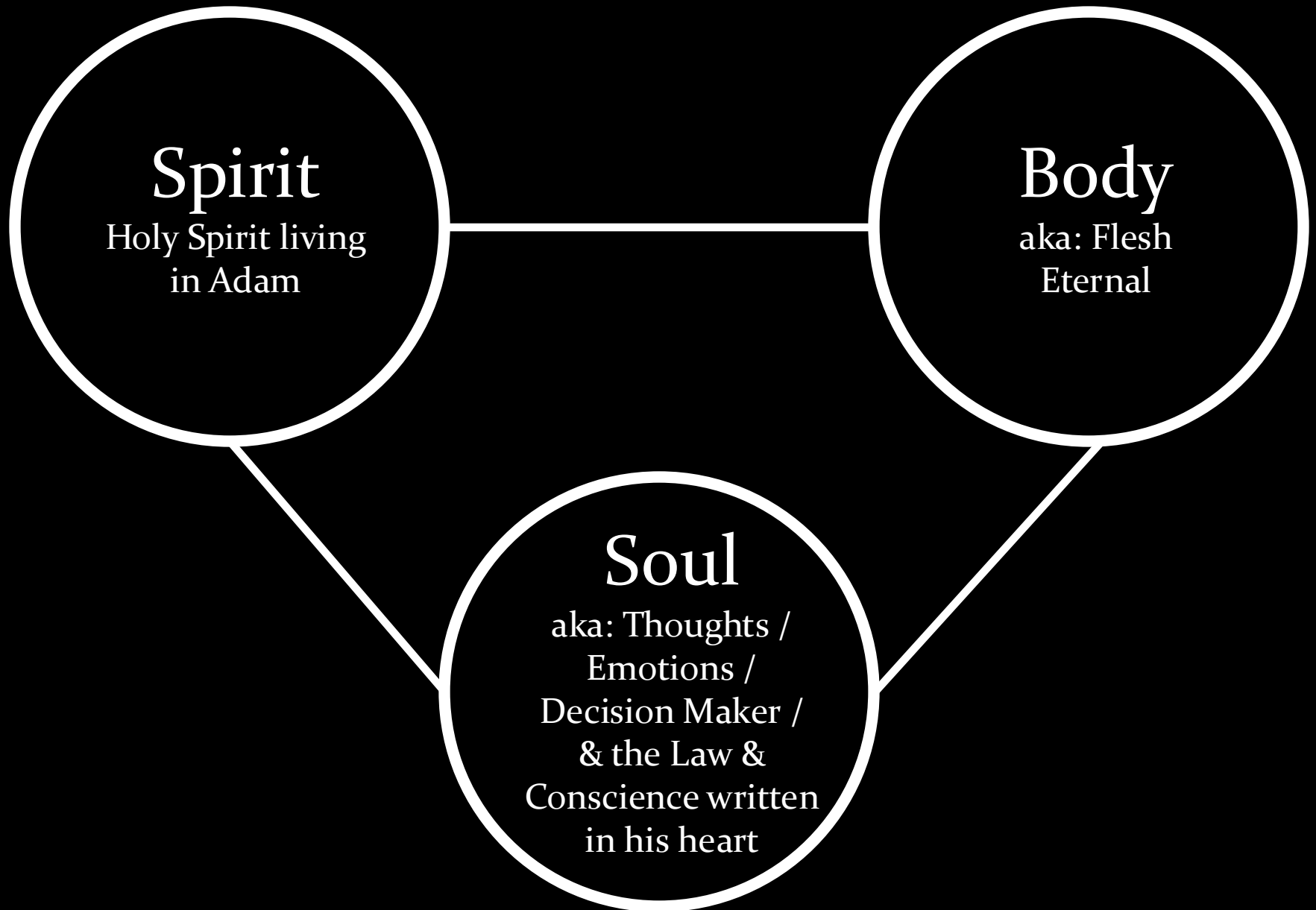
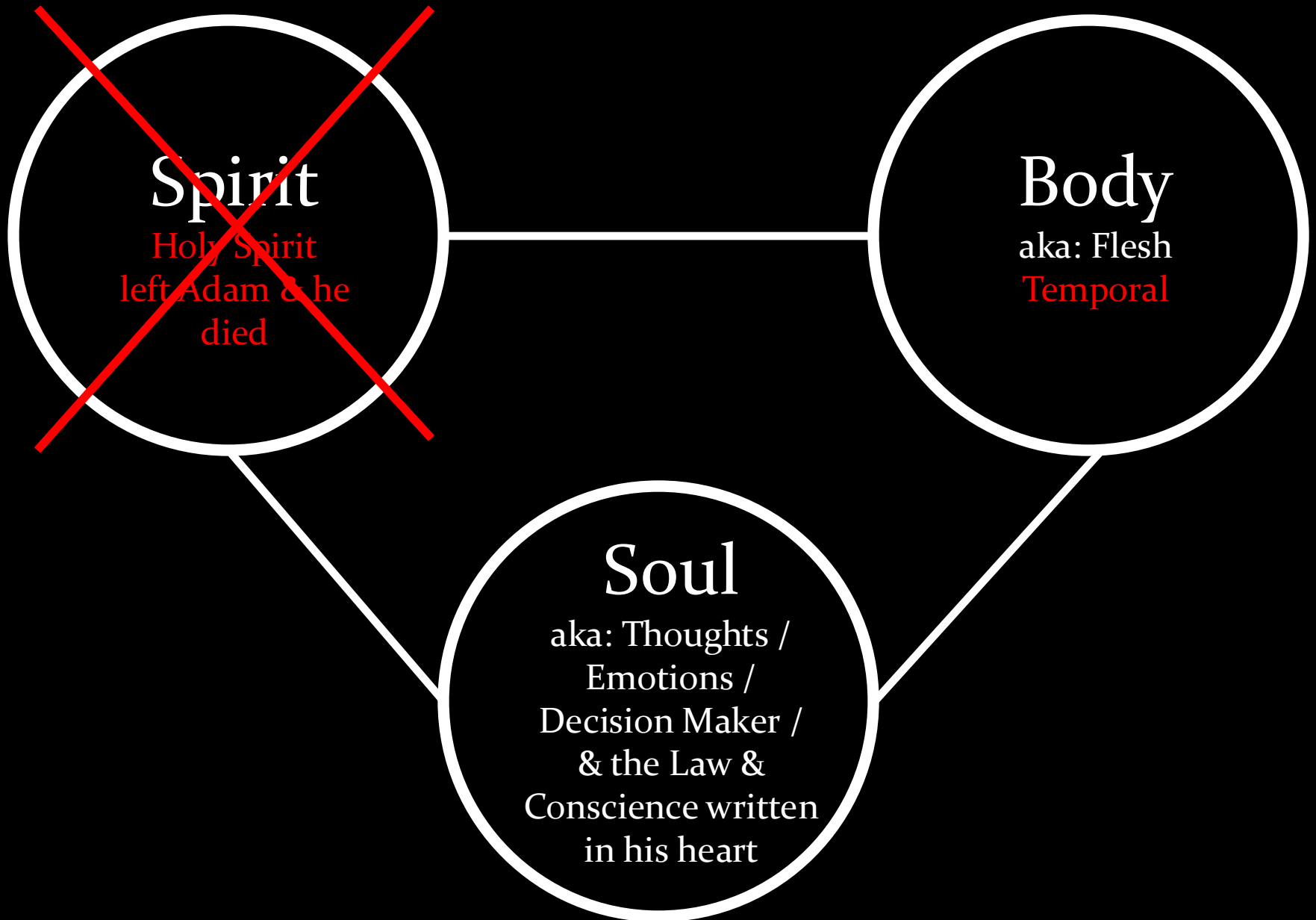


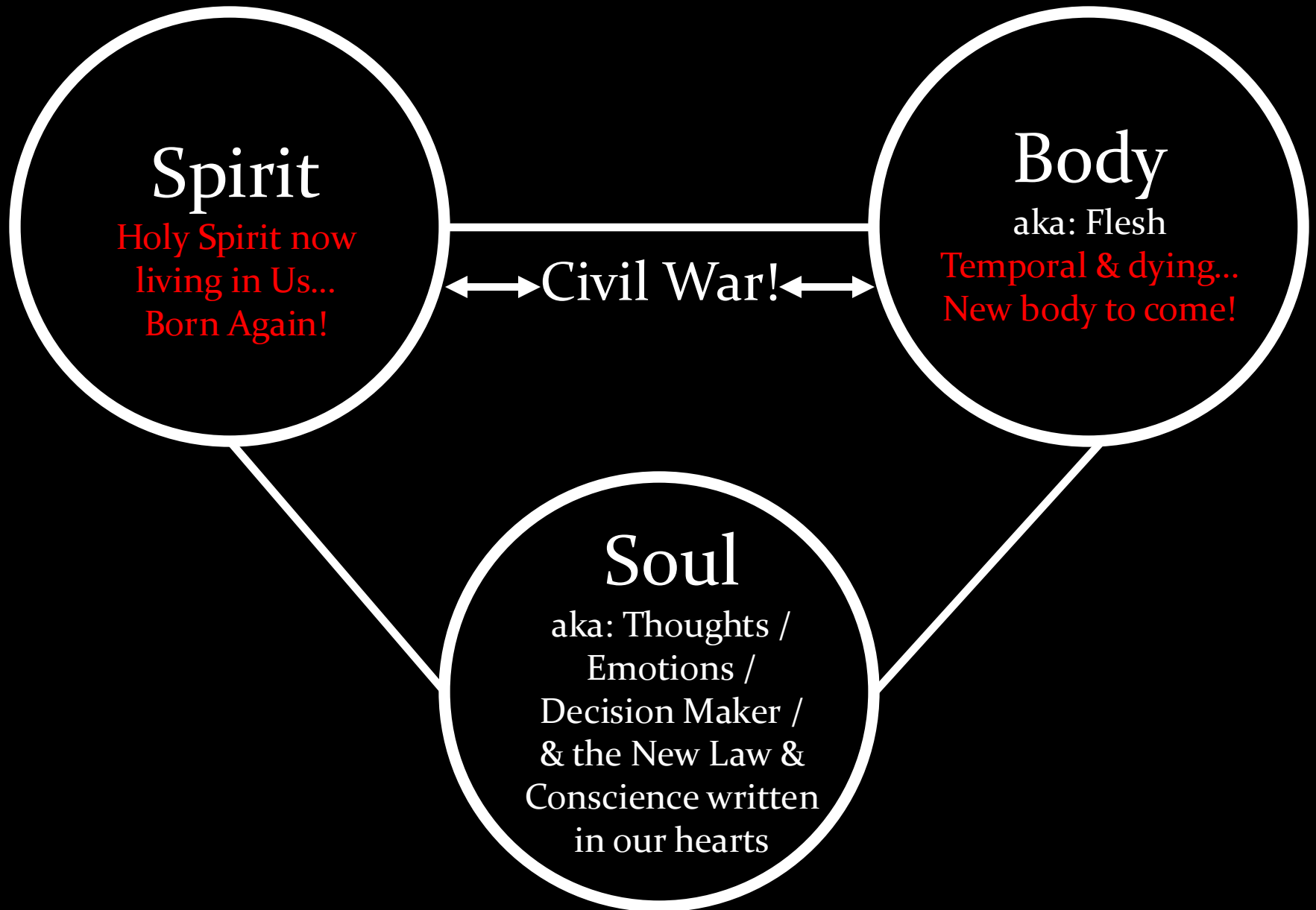
Adam Before Sin (Spiritually Alive)

Romans 6-8 – Questions to help us regarding “What we Need to Know!”

#1a – 6:1-2a – What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not!

#1b – 6:3 – Or do you not know...?

#2a – 6:15 – What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not!

#2b – 6:16 – Do you not know...?

#3 – 7:1 – Or do you now know brethren...that the law has dominion over a man as long as he lives.

#4a – 7:7a – What shall we say then? Is the law sin? Certainly not!

#4b – 7:7b – I would not have known...?

#4a – 7:13 – Has then what is good become death to me? Certainly not!

#5b – 7:14 – For we know...?

Romans 6:11-14 – “Things We Need to Do”

If we want to live victorious Christian Lives

#1 – 6:11a – We are to reckon ourselves to be dead indeed (or truly) to sin.
Also see Luke 9:23.
Also see Ephesians 4:20-22 (Put off).

#2 – 6:11b – We are to reckon ourselves to be alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
Also see Ephesians 4:23-24 (Put on).

Romans 6:12 – Implications if we don’t do #1 & #2 in v.11.

#3 – 6:13a – We are NOT to present our members (body or body parts) as instruments (weapons or tools) of unrighteousness to sin.
Also see Exodus 23:20-24 & 23:31-35.

#4 – 6:13b – We are to present our members as instruments of righteousness to God.

Romans 6:14 – Implications if we don’t do #3 & #4 in v.13.

Romans 6:15-23 – Paul reinforcing vv.11-14.

To help us live victorious Christian Lives

#1 – 6:15-16 – Paul asks a question since we're not under the Law of Moses, but the Law of the Spirit.

#2 – 6:17-22 – Paul gives 3 contrasts between who we were before Jesus vs. who we are now in Jesus.

Contrast #1 – vv.17-18.

Contrast #2 – v.19.

Contrast #3 – vv.20-22.

#3 – 6:23 – Paul makes a summary conclusion about our need to do the things we've studied today in Romans 6:11-14.

The Law of Moses (The Old Covenant)

= Commandments + Penalty + Remedy (Jesus)

Purpose #1: To point out our sins through the Commandments.

Romans 3:20, 5:20, 7:7, Galatians 3:19.

+

Purpose #2: To point out what we deserve due to sin...the penalty of death.

Romans 4:14-15, Galatians 3:10,21, Romans 7:11-13.
(Romans 7:11-13 contains both purpose #1 & #2 in them)

+

Purpose #3: To point out God's solution for our sin ... a blood sacrifice.

Galatians 3:22-24, Romans 7:4.

The Law of Moses

Does not apply to anyone once they're saved

Romans 10:4

For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

Galatians 3:23-25

“Before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed. Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.”

The Commandments of the Law of Moses

(2 types of laws in the Law – Which are confused by many)

1. Type 1: Moral

- Examples: Murder, Stealing, Lying, Adultery, etc.
 - These ARE repeated in the New Covenant because they represent our holy God and His nature.
- Some assert another type, “Civil”, as the enforcement of the law [but that is Purpose #2 of the law].

2. Type 2: Ceremonial

- Examples: Sabbath, Dietary Laws, Circumcision, Bodily Discharges, etc.
 - These ARE NOT repeated in the New Covenant because they represent of our need for Jesus.
 - So, once we come to Jesus they have been fulfilled.
 - In fact, we’re told specifically these do NOT apply to us anymore in the New Covenant (See Romans 14, Colossians 2:16-23, Galatians 5:6).

The Law of the Spirit

Romans 8:1-2 – No Condemnation (Discipline)

= Commandments + Discipline + Power

Commandments (All over the New Testament)

Moral Commandments

+

Discipline (1 Corinthians 5, Hebrews 12:3-11)

Our Father disciplines us thru the church or directly

+

Power (Acts 1:8, 2 Corinthians 12:9, 2 Timothy 1:7)

Indwelling & empowering Holy Spirit

So, we are not a lawless people!!!
