Nehemiah

Books Connected to Ezra 1-6

- #1 & #2 Jeremiah & Isaiah Prophesied the fall of Judah & Jeremiah even lived through the fall of Judah.
- #3 & #4 & #1 2 Kings & 2 Chronicles & Jeremiah Recorded the fall of Judah.
- #5 Ezekiel Prophesied in Babylon to the people of Judah who had been taken captive into Babylon from Judah.
- #1 & #2 Jeremiah & Isaiah Prophesied the return of some to Judah to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem, recorded in Ezra 1-6.
- #6 Daniel Acknowledged the prophesy of the return of some to Judah to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem.
- #7 Ezra Records the return of some to Judah to rebuild the temple as well as the rebuilding.
- #8 & #9 Haggai & Zechariah These 2 prophesied were sent by God to Jerusalem to rebuke the leaders in Jerusalem for not completing the temple.

Introduction to Ezra & Nehemiah & Esther

History of Israel and Judah's Captivities

- 1. 722BC The northern kingdom of Israel was taken captive by Assyria. Unfortunately, Judah didn't learn the lesson.
- 2. 605-586BC Judah was taking into captivity in phases by Babylon. They still didn't listen to God's prophets. Some of the prophecies were Isaiah 39:5-7, Jeremiah 25:1,8-9,20:4b, 21:7b.

The three waves of Nebuchadnezzar's invasions

- 1. 605BC During the reign of Jehoiakim.
- 2. 597BC During the reign of Jehoiachin.
- 3. 588-586BC During the reign of Zedekiah.

But the Lord also prophesied a return to the land

1. The Lord gave encouragement through prophets.

Some of the prophecies were Isaiah 44:28-45:5, Jeremiah 25:10-13, 29:10-14, Daniel 9:1-2.

The three waves of Jewish repatriations

- 1. 538BC Led by Zerubbabel due to a proclamation of Cyrus.
- 2. 458BC Led by Ezra due to the approval of Artaxerxes.
- 3. 445BC Led by Nehemiah due to the approval of Artaxerxes.

Overview of Ezra/Nehemiah/Esther

Overview (in chronological order)

- 1. Ezra 1-6 538BC Repatriation under the leadership of Zerubbabel. This covered a 23-year period from 538-515BC. This was done to rebuild the temple, completed in 515BC while Darius I was king.
- 2. Esther 484 or 483BC The people in Persia who didn't return. Esther covers Jewish people who stayed in Babylon. The book began in the year 484 or 483BC (3rd year of Ahasuerus-Esther 1:1,3). (Again, the events of this book occurred during the gap between Ezra 6 & 7).
- 3. Ezra 7-10 458BC Repatriation under the leadership of Ezra. This covered the events under Ezra after his return. And there was a gap of 57 years between Ezra 6 & 7 (From the completion of the temple in 515BC to Ezra's repatriation in 458BC). This was done to beautify the temple & rebuild the people's spiritual condition.
- 4. Nehemiah 445BC Repatriation under the leadership of Nehemiah. Nehemiah led this repatriation to rebuild the city and the walls of the city.

Ezra & Nehemiah could have likely been titled as follows

- 1. Zerubbabel Instead of Ezra 1-6.
- 2. Ezra Instead of Ezra 7-10.
- 3. Nehemiah For Nehemiah.
