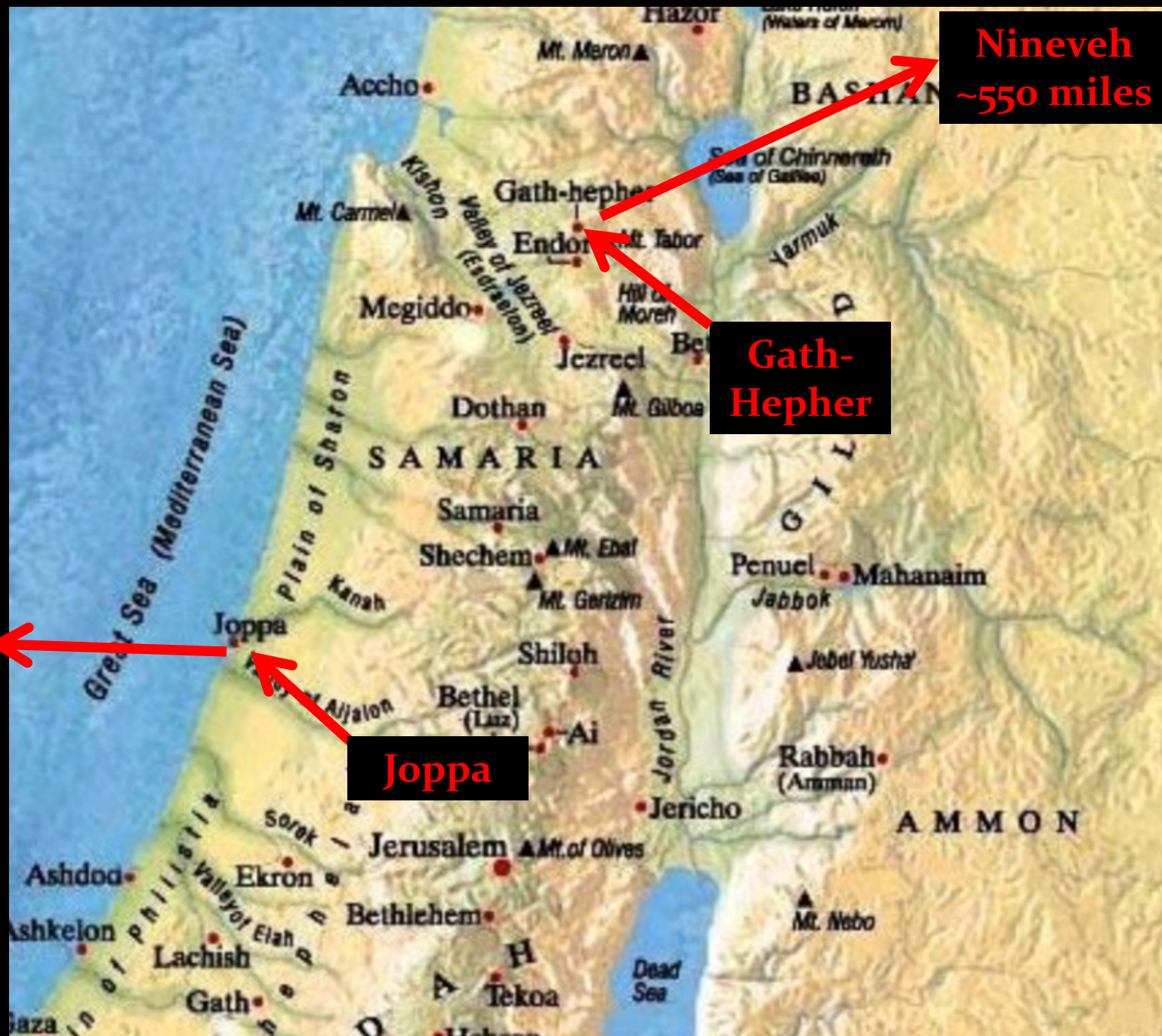

Jonah 2 – Lessons from Jonah's Prayer

#1 – v.1b – We can pray to God from anywhere.

#2 – v.1b – Our posture in prayer isn't that important.

#3 – v.2a & 3 – God will use afflictions to get us to cry out to Him.

#4 – v.2b – When we repent & cry out, He is ready to hear & answer us.

#5 – v.4a – Disobedience impairs our fellowship with the Lord.

#6 – v.4b – We can always look to the Lord again.

#7 – vv.5-6b – Disobedience leads to very undesirable consequences.

#8 – v.6c – The Lord responds when we turn to Him.

#9 – v.7 – We are blessed whenever we remember our Lord.

#10 – v.8 – Idolatry, in any form, is to forsake mercy.

#11 – v.9 – It is never too late to repent & to commit to obey Him.

#12 – v.10 – The Lord will still use us when we repent.
