Romans 5:1-11 — The Blessings of Justification

(Justification: The act of being made right or righteous with God)

- Blessing #1 v.1 We have peace with God.
- Blessing #2 v.2a We have access into God's amazing grace.
- Blessing #3 v.2b We get to boast (rejoice) in the hope of the glory of God.
- Blessing #4 v.3 We get to boast (glory) IN tribulations because of all God does for us when we're in them.
- Blessing #5 v.5a The love of God has been poured out in our hearts.
- Blessing #6 v.5b The Holy Spirit was given to us.
- Blessing #7 v.9 We shall be saved from wrath through Him.
- **Blessing** #8 v.10a We were reconciled to God.
- **Blessing** #9 v.10b We shall be saved by His life.
- Blessing #10 v.11 We get to boast (or rejoice) in God through Jesus (because They offered us reconciliation).

Romans 3:20 to 5:2 Terminology

- Term #1a Faith (20 times)
 - What we trust in or believe in.
- Term #1b Believe (7 times)

What we trust in or believe in. The same root word as faith.

- Term #2a Righteousness (12 times)
 - "To be righteous" or "to be right" or "to be in a right standing with God".
- Term #2b Justify or Justified or Justifier or Justification (9 times)
 This is the same word as "righteous" above, but in the verb form.
 In other words, it is the act of God making a person right or righteous.
- Term #3 Imputed or Accounted or Counted (12 times)

 "To put "or "to reck on /gradit "" something to a parse

"To put..." or "to reckon/credit..." "...something to a person's account".

- Term #4 Redemption (1 time)
 - "To release something or someone through a payment." Or, "to liberate through the payment of a ransom".
- Term #5 Propitiation (1 time)

An elusive meaning. But it carries the concept of a person who makes payment or gives compensation for a wrong committed.
