## **Exodus 1-18 – The deliverance of God’s people from bondage in Egypt.**

### God’s plan of deliverance from physical bondage.

**Exodus 1** – The oppression of Israel in Egypt.

**Exodus 2-4** – The deliverer of Israel from Egypt.

Exodus 2 – Moses’ birth & upbringing.

Exodus 3-4 – Moses’ calling.

**Exodus 5:1-12:36** – The struggle of Moses with Pharaoh in Egypt.

Exodus 5:1-7:14 – Moses’ confrontations with Pharaoh.

Exodus 7:15-12:36 – God’s plagues upon Egypt to free His people.

**Exodus 12:37-18:27** – The deliverance of Israel from Egypt.

## **Exodus 19-40 – The revelation of the Old Covenant (aka the Law of Moses) to Israel.**

### God’s plan of deliverance from spiritual bondage.

**Exodus 19-31** – The covenant of God with His people aka the Law of Moses.

**Exodus 32-34** – The failure and restoration of God’s people.

**Exodus 35-40** – The construction of the tabernacle.

# Israelites who went to Egypt

## A Possible Explanation of numbers

Jacob's children & grandchildren (excluding a son of Benjamin not yet born *)	66	Genesis 46:26
Jacob & the son's wives still alive	<u>4</u>	3 wives were still alive in Canaan
Total that went to Egypt	70	Genesis 46:27, Deu 10:22
Joseph's family & a son of Benjamin	<u>5</u>	Benjamin's son born after arrival
Jacob & all of his family & wives	<u>75</u>	Acts 7:14 **

\* - The child not born is assumed to be Benjamin's since he was the youngest and had the most children.

I also assume the child was alive in the womb, so the child called but not yet counted in the numbers (66 not 67).

\*\* - Some say the number in Acts 7:14 was actually 70, not 75.
