Discussion Questions

- What do you know about the story of Noah? How did you hear it taught growing up- or did you? What mental pictures come to mind when you think about Noah and the Ark?
- Read Genesis 6 and 7. What stands out to you about Noah? Why do you think that God chose him for this task?
- Imagine that you are Noah. What would have been challenging or hard about what God asked of him? What do you think helped Noah during times of discouragement?
- Think about the idea of walking closely with God. How close is your current relationship with Jesus? If you were sitting down for coffee with Jesus, what do you think He'd say?
- Consider Noah's character—described as "blameless."
 What does that word mean to you? How would your life be described these days? Where is Jesus wanting to grow your character?
- Noah's obedience to God wasn't easy—building the ark took many years and was likely seen as a foolish (even crazy) endeavor. What steps of risky obedience might God be inviting you into? What is a step you could take this week?
