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Welcome to our study of Hebrew numerology. Now, I make mention of Hebrew numerology. But I could have said just as well, biblical numerology. The reason why I stress Hebrew numerology is because Judaism tends to put a greater emphasis on the numbers that appear in the Bible, more than what we find in Christianity. But everything I'm sharing with you, is based upon what Scripture says, not what the rabbi's necessarily teach, or Judaism embraces but what we find in the Word of God. Now, in our previous installment, we dealt with the number five, as I mentioned to you, many within Christianity see the number five, as relating to grace, we did not present it in this way, because when we examined scripture, five has to do with that which is lacking that which is incomplete that which is not hold. But it's this number, the number six, the number that we're going to study briefly in this, this session, that is going to be shown as relating to grace. And let's just begin and deal with this. Six, if you look at what many Christians say, relates to the number of man, this is false, it's based upon a false understanding of what's said in the Book of Revelation, towards the end of chapter 13, where we have that famous number 666. Now, even though many people relate that number as 666, it's literally 666, not six. And it doesn't say that it's the number of man, but rather, it relates to a man a particular man. And of course, the context would would demand that that man that that number relates to is the Antichrist. Now, some will say that the number six speaks about the frailties of humanity, that we are weak, that we are sinful, and that we fail God. But again, when we look at the Scripture, we see something very different than that. For example, we know God, and God's perfect plan. He created the heavens in the earth in six days, and He made man on the sixth day. And we in order to have life, because of the fall, we need God's grace. And it's only through God's grace, that we can experience God's purposes. God's plan, let me say it's simply God's will. So the number six relates to God's grace and biblically, Grace brings us into God's will, it brings a godly change into our life, Grace does. And we see that relating to the significance of the number six. Let me give you another example. According to the Word of God, humanity, man works six days, and then on the seventh day, he enters into Shabbat. I have shared many times that biblically, Shabbat or the Sabbath day relates to the kingdom. And so what we see here is that there's six days of labor, we are called to work. And through those six days, six relates to grace. And therefore, it's the sixth day, that day of grace, that brings us into a fellowship with God, the Shabbat, the Sabbath day, we know as well, a Hebrew slave according to the law of Moses, he would work six years. And then at the end of the six year, he would go free, why six relates to grace, and

grace sets us free, and that setting free is for the purpose of restoration. No longer must he serve his master, now, he is able through the grace that six year brings to him, he's able now to serve God. So the number six relates to grace and it puts us in God's will and order that we might do God's will and Allah muddling God's will is for His redeemed people and were deemed by grace to enter into His kingdom. Well, there's one more passage I want us to look at. And remember, the whole purpose of this series is not so that you just agree with me. But rather, that you will open up your Bibles that you can use a concordance that you can look at these numbers as they appear both in the Old and the New Testaments, and make that determination for yourself. But let me give you one more place in the Bible, that the number six appears. Now we see that in the book of Isaiah and chapter six, it is in that chapter that that Isaiah receives a call upon his life, and he feels unworthy. He is a man of unclean lips, and therefore he seems an adequate. And then we're taken to a picture, a picture of an angel, not just any angel, but a seraphim. And the seraphim were told that they have and hear this six wings. And we find that that they use all six wings in their service. And what happens? Well, one of these Serafin, the Bible says that he flies over any takes a coal, a hot coal, with with tongs, and what does he do? He takes that hot coal, and he touches the lips of Isaiah. And what happens? He takes away the sin, the iniquity, it has an atoning a purifying a cleansing effect upon Isaiah. And again, it's not by chance that this six wing Sarafem did this. Because it's relating to the ministry, the work the outcome of grace, it's only through the grace of God, that one can be forgiven. It is through grace that God deals with our iniquity, our sinfulness, the fact that we're impure the fact that in and of ourselves, we are not able to serve God. But because of this six wing Sarafem that touched Isaiah, wood, that hot coal, we see that Isaiah was commissioned, and he was used mightily by God. And this as well teaches us another very important part of the number six, because the grace of God, the grace of God, when we receive it, it changes us, in order that we can identify, connect to and carry out the will of God, learn the very important truth. There's a connection between grace and the will of God. So we are saved by grace, not of works, but through the grace of God, that grace works in our life. And it causes us to do righteous service before God. Grace changes us makes us servants of God, so that we can carry out the will of God the purposes of God, and achieve what God is interested in. And that is a righteous people. We are declared righteous by faith and praise God for that. But God isn't just interested in our being declared as righteous. But what interests God and why God anoints us with His Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit dwells in us, is in order for us to demonstrate righteousness, in Word and indeed, so the grace of God is given, so that we can be saved, that we can experience redemption, that we can become a kingdom inhabitant, a kingdom citizen, so that we can do Kingdom work. All of this is the outcome of grace and our life. And I strongly encourage you to look at the places where the number six appears in the Bible. And you will see that number six relates to grace. And you will see that grace works in a person's life, to bring them into the will of God showed that they can carry out the will of God. The number six relates to the grace of God Everyone
