

#4, Jesus & The Enemy

Luke 3:21-4:15, Genesis 3:1-15, 1 John 3:8

This weekend we're looking at Jesus' conversation with the (our) Enemy. Let's face it, this is a conversation that many of us wrestle with every day. I really believe that God wants to do a healing work this weekend in our minds and hearts! I invite you to turn in your Bibles to Luke 3.

Luke 3:21

- The beginning of these two dramatic encounters in Luke are preceded by prayer.
 - Prayer is conversation with God!
 - Prayer is how we can experience a 1:1 conversation with God!

Luke 3:22

- More than just a brief moment between the Father and the Son, these two verses provide one of the clearest biblical pictures of the Trinity in action.
 - The Bible continually speaks of a doctrine of "The Trinity".
 - o The Doctrine of the Trinity says that God exists as 3 people, 1 God!
 - The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
 - These verses provide clear evidence for the doctrine of the Trinity!

Luke 3:23-38

- Jesus was the same age as Joseph (Gen 41) and David (2 Sam 5) when he began to lead!
- What follows in Luke's Gospel is the genealogy of Jesus going all the way back to Adam.
 - Luke is trying to show us that Jesus is like a new Adam, is about to enter a new battle to redeem a new people.

(Genesis 3:15)

- The Enemy is a created being under the authority of God!
- Genesis 3:15 includes the earliest indication of *someone* would come and bruise the head/ crush the life/ destroy the work of the Adversary!
 - o Here we see that the first temptation of man occurred in a garden and he failed!
 - But this temptation of the second man, the second Adam, occurs in a wilderness and He is victorious!!

Luke 4:1-2

- On the heels of His moment of greatest affirmation, Jesus enters into His greatest temptation!
 - It seems only right that Jesus, who came to "destroy the devil's work" should begin his own ministry with a conflict with the Enemy...

1 John 3:8

The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.

- 40 isn't just a random number in scripture it's a number rich in biblical significance.
 - o ISRAEL was in the wilderness for 40 years (Deut. 8)
 - MOSES was on Mt. Sinai 40 days and nights (Ex. 34)
 - o ELIJAH was led for 40 days and nights (1 Kgs. 19)
- In each one of these accounts, the timeframe (40 days/ years) was God's proving ground for His promise of deliverance and victory!
 - o If you're in a season of testing and from the Enemy, realize that the Enemy is a created being operating within a time approved by the Lord!

Luke 4:3

- Remember the last words still echoing in Jesus' ears...
 - "You are my beloved Son... in whom I am well pleased."
 - Satan says, "Are you sure?"
 - The enemy will STRIKE confusion where it hurts the most at the center of identity!
 - Q: Do you ever lay in bed at night and thinking that you're a failure?
- When you feel defeated, it's a good sign that Satan is at work within your inner world of thoughts!

Who you think that you are will determine how you live!

Luke 4:4-7

- What does Jesus do?
 - He quotes scripture! The quote is Deut. 8:3
 - It's the passage where Moses reminded the Israelites in their own wilderness that they should trust God's word rather than the manna he gave them.
 - O How much more do we need to know the Word of God to declare it to the enemy when he comes to destroy our lives!!
 - The crucial step towards breakthrough in your wilderness is to speak God's truth!

Did you know that something doesn't need to be true to be devastating to your life, it just simply needs be believed by you!

Luke 4:8-15

- Three times we see Jesus using the same weapon in reply to the enemy's temptations!
 - Even though Jesus was full of the Holy Spirit, his weapon of defense was the Word of God!
 - Why, because the Word is Truth! (Ephesians 6:17)
 - The most central and significant part of a believer's life is to learn to recognize the voices of lies and to distinguish them from word of God's truth!
 - Use the simple but direct weaponry of God's word to rebut lies with truth.

Here are 4 practical pointers when you're feeling talked about/to by the Enemy:

- 1) **Believe** God's Word and engage in worship!
- 2) **Declare** the truth through prayer and writing!
- 3) **Change** up your schedule and get out of the house!
- 4) **Get** a good night's sleep!

Don't waste any more days in your life wondering and fearing with the Enemy is (or is not) saying about you!
