

# #5, Jesus & Cleopas

Luke 24:12-36

*We're in a series called ONE...!* It's a short series looking at the conversations of Jesus! Today is the penultimate message in our ONE series. Today we're looking at the well-known account in Luke 24. Our conversation is packed full of drama, passion, disappointment, recognition and mission! It's known as the 'Road to Emmaus'.

## Luke 24:12

- Our Emmaus conversation picks up after the public execution of Jesus.
  - Probably just a couple of hours after Peter has relayed what he had seen, and the reports started to circulate among the disciples, a couple is walking out of Jerusalem!

## Luke 24:13

- Obviously through the years there has been a great deal of discussion on who these people are.
  - Most historians agree however, that it is most likely that the two people were a married couple. Later we learn of one of their names, Cleopas (*or Clopas*).
    - Based upon the historical agreement, the other person in this conversation is likely his wife, Mary! (John 19:25)

# Luke 24:14

- <u>To understand the significance of this conversation, we need to put ourselves in their sandals.</u>
  - We need to imagine where they were at in their mental and emotional state. For us to be able to do that, we need to enter into the mindset of a 1st century Jew in the early hours following the crucifixion!
- As they exited out of Jerusalem's Western Gate, their hearts would have been filled with despair!
  - They would have thought to themselves, Jesus is dead, and our hope has died with him!
  - This is the third day and the horror of it all has become their new reality.
    - And now, rumors are beginning to surface about the whereabouts of the body!

#### Luke 24:15-16

- It's Jesus walking with them, but for whatever reason, they did not realize it was Jesus.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  The last time they had seen Him He was beaten, marred, and bleeding out...  $\;$
  - Jesus is in a glorified body and they don't know who it is... BUT THEY WOULD SOON!

#### Luke 24:17

- Jesus' execution was about the only thing people were talking about in Jerusalem.
  - It had been the tragic climax to a *passionate* week of controversy and confrontation and now they're at a standstill and are completely lost!

#### Luke 24:18-21

- It wasn't just that Jesus, the bearer of their hopes, was now dead and gone!
- <u>It was worse than that!</u>
  - If Jesus had been the one to redeem Israel, He would have defeated the Roman pagans and not died at their hands!
  - As Jews, their understanding of the Messiah was of one who would defeat the Roman powers and not be defeated by them and end up on their cross.
    - The dream was dead and they were done!

#### Luke 24:22-24

- Do you have times in your walk with Jesus where you're disappointed by Him !?
- We can go through hopeless seasons where we can wonder if Jesus has abandoned us completely!
  Dry times are actually a normal part of the Christian life and can actually be a gift to us.

#### Luke 24:25-26

- The *stranger* (Jesus) looked with compassion right into Cleopas' soul.
  - Jesus compassionately heals our unbelief through leading us into the scriptures!
  - For the next two hours this *stranger* walked Cleopas and his friend through the entire scriptures and connected all of the references to Jesus Christ!

#### Luke 24:27-29

- Jesus says this was the Father's plan all along! Everything points to Jesus! It's all about Jesus!
  - Imagine Jesus sitting down with you explaining Genesis 22 How the charge to sacrifice Isaac foreshadowed the atonement (*at-one-moment*) that He accomplished on the cross?
    - At the end of the long Bible exposition their eyes were opened to God's plan of redemption!
      - The fire that had died out at Golgotha was coming back to life!

#### Luke 24:30-31

- Mary, the wife of Cleopas (Clopas) had earlier been at the foot of the cross. (John 19:25)
  - She saw His blood flow. She heard His screams. She experienced the darkness.
    - Mary had no doubt at all that Jesus was dead!
      - But as soon as the bread touched their hands they <u>recognized</u> who it was...

#### Luke 24:32

- Jesus is the only one who can answer the cry of the human heart for longing and purpose!
  - Surrender your heart to Jesus Christ?

#### Luke 24:33-36

- There is always a story to tell when someone has met with Jesus!
  - o It was this moment that completely transformed the early-believers into kingdom-shakers!!
  - They had the unshakeable conviction that something world-changing had happened.
    - Not even death could defeat them...!
  - They were a people completely <u>transformed</u> by the <u>bodily resurrection of Jesus.</u>
  - They were a people completely <u>transformed</u> by their <u>conversations with Jesus.</u>
