Commentary on **Psalm 82** _____

Vs 37–39 • Jesus then “doubles down” on His divine claim from vs 30: His works are the Father’s works. And the Father is IN Him, and He is IN the Father! The Jews know this, and again try to seize Him.

So—why did Jesus quote this obscure passage in Psalm 82? Answer: He isn’t saying He himself is a “lesser, human god” like these judges. He is using this scripture to confound His enemies and stop a stoning, just as in John 8, with the woman caught in adultery.
