## FOUNDATIONS OF OUR FAITH "The Library is Closed"

How do we know the Bible is complete and 'closed'— no books missing, and nothing else to be added?

Previously we studied proofs for the Bible: PRAISE HIM	
We also looked at "Canonicity"—how inspired scripture was identified by the early Church.  • Written by a Prophet or Apostle  • Received as scripture by the original audience • 1 Thess 2:13	
<ul> <li>Preserved as scripture • Revelation 1:11</li> <li>Distributed as scripture • Colossians 4:16</li> <li>Authoritative • 2 Peter 1:19</li> <li>Evidence of being "living and active" • Hebrews 4:12</li> <li>Error free &amp; in harmony with the rest of scripture • John 17:8</li> </ul>	
But how do we know the Bible ("library") is a CLOSED canon? How do we know other so-called scriptures are not truly inspired, but are dangerous substitutes for God's truth?	
WARNINGS NOT TO ADD TO GOD'S WORD	
Deuteronomy 4:2, 18:20–22 • Proverbs 30:5–6 • Jeremiah 23:28–40 • 1 Kings 13 • Isaiah 8:20	
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WHAT ABOUT THE APOSTLE PAUL?	
Paul is UNIQUE among the "non–12" prophets because he was commissioned directly by Jesus ( <b>Acts 9</b> ). He was then RECOGNIZED and ACCEPTED by the "12" ( <b>Acts 9:26–28</b> )	
2 Peter 3:14-17 • Peter calls Paul's writings SCRIPTURE!!!	
What is the PROOF of Paul's PROPHETIC APOSTLESHIP? He does MIRACLES, just as Peter did = healings, raising the dead, released from prison, powerful preaching!  For Peter: See Acts 3, 5, & 9 especially For Paul: See Acts 16 & 19, especially	
TO SUM UP • The PROPHETIC APOSTLES (inspired prophets writing the scriptures) were SANCTIONED and COMMISSIONED by "the Twelve" who Jesus said would be filled with the Spirit to know and remember His words.	
Matthew = A "12" apostle Mark = Peter's secretary / also "useful" to Paul Luke = Paul's traveling companion & physician John = A "12" apostle Paul = last & least apostle	
Peter = A "12" apostle  James = brother of Jesus  Jude = brother of Jesus  Hebrews = unknown, but likely Paul	
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WHY IS A "CLOSED CANON" CRITICAL?	
(From "answerthebible.com") Belief in a defined canon of holy Scripture provides a protective barrier for the church. Having a closed set of books that comprise the Bible enables crucial safeguards:	
<ol> <li>Prevents fabrication • 2. Upholds authority • 3. Promotes unity</li> <li>Guards sound doctrine • 5. Rebuffs heresy</li> <li>Shields from cultural trends • 7. Maintains moral boundaries</li> </ol>	
WHAT ABOUT THE SPIRITUAL GIFT OF PROPHECY?	
1 Thessalonians 5:19–22 • Don't quench the spirit; Don't despise prophecy; BUT test everything!	
How are we to test the spiritual gift of prophecy? EASY: see if it lines up with SCRIPTURE!	
What IS the spiritual gift of prophecy? To answer this, consider what it is to accomplish	
1 Cor 14:3, 29–31 • edification, exhortation, consolation!	
It can also involve "revelation" (also involving other spiritual gifts, such as knowledge or discernment, for example)—but these are to be TESTED; those listening must PASS JUDGMENT and give confirmation to what is shared.	
A dangerous type of "prophecy" in the church today are folks who are declaring new revelations from God apart from scripture, and holding these up on par with the same authority as the Bible.	
The BEST USE of prophecy in the church today is the APPLICATION of scripture in Bible teaching: <i>Because God's Word says</i> , <i>I believe God wants us to apply this truth to</i> and obey it in!!!	
And then, like good Bereans, the church can examine the scriptures and see if this message lines up (Acts 17:11).	
So, instead of ADDING new "scriptures"—how about we simply try to obey the ones God has clearly given us!?! (James 1:25)
