

Vs 26–28 • Terah’s sons: Abram, Nahor, & Haran (dies young)
Terah’s family were idol worshipers (Joshua 14:1–2)

Vs 29–30 • Abram marries Sarai
She is the first barren woman in scripture
She was beautiful despite her advanced age

Vs 31–32 • Terah takes his family out of Ur
12:1–3 • Abram’s vision surely prompted Terah’s move
But they stop at a placed called “Haran” / Terah doesn’t enter Canaan
His name means: “Delay” (Matthew 8:18–22)

Genesis 9:20–24 • Review from Sunday
Covenant • Carelessness • Cruelty • Compassion
A picture of the Gospel:
Ham = the devil / Shem & Japheth = Jesus

Vs 25 • Noah’s curse on Ham

Vs 26–27 • “Canaan” to serve Shem & Japheth

Vs 28–29 • Noah has a long lifespan
“Be fruitful & multiply” (vs 7)

Ch 10:1 • Generations of Noah

Vs 2 Sons of Japheth include: “Gog, Magog, Rosh, Meshech, & Tubal”
Compare to Ezekiel 38:1–4 & 39:1–4

Vs 3–5 • languages will be divided at Babel

Vs 6–14 • Sons of Ham

Vs 8–12 • Nimrod = “rebel”
Micah 5:5–6 • compares Nimrod to an antichrist

Vs 15–20 • Sons of Canaan (the son of Ham)

Vs 21–31 • Sons of Shem

Vs 25 • Peleg (“divided”) was named for the dividing of languages at Babel

Genesis 11:1–9 • Tower of Babel (Sunday’s study)

11:10–26 • Genealogy of Shem–Terah
(Notice the diminishing lifespans—)

- Vs 10–11 • Shem / lives 600 years**
- Vs 11–13 • Arpachshad / 438 years**
- Vs 12–15 • Shelah / 433 years**
- Vs 14–17 • Eber / 464 years**
- Vs 16–19 • Peleg / 239 years**
- Vs 18–21 • Reu / 239 years**
- Vs 20–23 • Serug / 230 years**
- Vs 22–25 • Nahor / 148 years**
- Vs 24–26 • Terah / 205 years**
