## Review Jacob & Esau

**Ch 25** • Esau despises his birthright, selling it to Jacob for a bowl of stew **26:34–35** • Esau marries two Canaanite women, bringing grief to his parents

27:46 • Rebekah says she is "weary of life" because of Esau's wives

Big Idea • Esau rejecting his birthright for a bowl of stew is symbolic of
rejecting God for his own "gods"—his flesh and his independence

Esau's Empty Tears • When Jacob steals the blessing, securing his
birthright, Esau begs in tears for a blessing, but there is no real
repentance in his heart; he harbors bitterness and murderous hatred
toward his brother

2 • Isaac put his wife between!				
She was willing to risk taking Jacob's CURSE upon herself.
