- 1) Moses chose to identify with the suffering people of God rather than enjoy the pleasures and treasures of Egypt - **what comforts, status, or worldly advantages might God be asking you to willingly set aside in order to align more fully with His purposes?**
- 2) Moses endured by seeing Him who is invisible, as stated in Hebrews 11:27 - **what spiritual disciplines or practices help you keep your eyes fixed on the invisible God when the visible pressures of life feel overwhelming?**
- 3) The sermon draws a parallel between the blood applied to the doorposts in Exodus 12 and the covering of Christ's blood for believers today - **how does the assurance of being under the blood of Jesus practically affect the way you face fear in your everyday life?**
- 4) Moses had fear and faith simultaneously, and the sermon argues that faith can coexist with and ultimately overcome fear - **can you think of a time when you acted in faith despite genuine fear, and what did that experience reveal to you about the nature of trust in God?**

- 1) The sermon warns that many people make excuses similar to Moses - claiming someone else is more qualified or gifted - when called to serve God - **what specific calling or assignment do you believe God has placed before you that you have been reluctant to accept, and what would it look like to step into it by faith?**
