INTRO

ANTIOCH: PURPOSE FILLED CHURCH

- A church where everyone shared the Gospel
- Everyday, ordinary Joes took the Gospel to their Gentile neighbors.

OUR TEXT TODAY REVEALS THAT THEY WERE A CHURCH THAT SAW/THOUGHT BEYOND THEIR OWN NEEDS

Acts 11:27-30 ESV

²⁷ Now in these days prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. ²⁸ And one of them named Agabus stood up and foretold by the Spirit that there would be a great famine over all the world (this took place in the days of Claudius). ²⁹ So the disciples determined, every one according to his ability, to send relief to the brothers living in Judea. ³⁰ And they did so, sending it to the elders by the hand of Barnabas and Saul.

1: OPENNESS TO THE PROPHETIC WORD

PROPHETS CAME DOWN

• NT describes 'offices' of ministry:

Ephesians 4:11-12 ESV

- ¹¹ And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,
- Antioch church embraced and received this ministry.
- There's a humility required to acknowledge outside help and voices they didn't assume they had it all figured out.

1 Thessalonians 5:19-21 ESV

- ¹⁹ Do not quench the Spirit. ²⁰ Do not despise prophecies, ²¹ but test everything; hold fast what is good.
- Ultimately, they had to discern the voice of the Holy Spirit in confirming this message –
 'test the spirits'

AGABUS FORETOLD A FAMINE WOULD COME

- Note: There's two types of prophetic words
 - Forthtelling: proclaiming and applying God's word to people today
 - Foretelling: Spirit-born message about what is to come
- Agabus' message:

- Foretelling: There's a famine coming
- Forthtelling: (Would've been) We should give to help them out
- Historical note:
 - Claudius was emperor from 41-54 AD
 - His reign was marked by a long series of crop failures in Rome, Egypt, Judea, and Greece
 - Egyptian documents reveal a major famine there (Judea) in A.D. 45-46 due to flooding.
 - Most likely Paul and Barnabas trip to Jerusalem was in 46 AD with their offering/benevolence

THEY DETERMINED TO GIVE

- Note: Agabus doesn't tell them to give, they made the determination to.
- This reveals the attitude and condition of their heart.
- They were willing and desiring to be a blessing to others
- Particularly their brothers and sisters in the faith.

2: THINKING BEYOND THEIR OWN NEEDS

Philippians 2:4-8 ESV

⁴ Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. ⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

THE HEART AND MIND OF CHRIST IS TO EMPTY OURSELVES

- In obedience to God
- In service to others

THE CHURCH IN ANTIOCH HAD THIS HEART

- They heard about a coming calamity/crisis and they acted.
- They didn't just focus on their own wants and needs, but considered what was also in the interest of others

NOTICE THAT LOVE FOR CHRIST SPILLS OVER INTO LOVE FOR BROTHER

1 John 3:14 ESV

¹⁴ We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers. Whoever does not love abides in death.

PARTNERING TO MEET A NEED

Philippians 4:19 ESV

¹⁹ And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

- Our experience has been that you can't out give God.
 - (first \$10k donation to camp years ago)

3: EVERYONE GAVE ACCORDING TO THEIR ABILITY

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN TITHES & OFFERINGS (MISSIONS GIVING)

- Tithes = 10% of income and given to your local church to fund the ministry
 - I always say, if everyone tithed we would have more than enough to meet the needs all around.
- Offerings = free will
 - Whatever the Lord puts on your heart, according to your ability.

2 Corinthians 9:7-10 ESV

⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. ⁹ As it is written, "He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever." ¹⁰ He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness.

• Paul again receiving and offering for the saints in Jerusalem

EQUAL SACRIFICE, NOT EQUAL GIVING

- Recognize that we all won't be able to give the same amounts.
- Jesus honored the poor widow who gave her last two cents in comparison to the wealthy who gave out of their abundance.
- The challenge for us is to:
 - Consider others needs beyond my own
 - Determine how I can help contribute to meeting a need
 - Do so, unto the Lord with a cheerful heart in love for him.
 - In part, we show our love for the Lord, in the way we love His people

ONE STEP FURTHER

- Lets not limit the application of this passage to just financial giving
- Let's be generous with our time, talents, and abilities
- Let's serve one another
