## "WHY DID JESUS COME?"

(2 Corinthians 3:12-18)

**Introduction: Luke 1:76–77**, <sup>76</sup> "And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; For you will go on before the Lord to prepare His ways; <sup>77</sup> To give to His people *the* knowledge of salvation By the forgiveness of their sins,"

<sup>12</sup> Therefore having such a hope, we use great boldness in *our* speech,

## I. JESUS CAME BECAUSE THE LAW DOES NOT PRODUCE GOD-DIRECTED FAITH

<sup>13</sup> and *are* not like Moses, *who* used to put a veil over his face so that the sons of Israel would not look intently at the end of what was fading away. <sup>14</sup> But their minds were hardened; for until this very day at the reading of the old covenant the same veil remains unlifted, because it is removed in Christ.

## II. JESUS CAME BECAUSE THE LAW WILL NOT RESULT IN HEARTCHANGING SALVATION

<sup>15</sup> But to this day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their heart;

## III. JESUS CAME BECAUSE THE LAW CANNOT LEAD TO TRUE SPIRITUAL FREEDOM

<sup>17</sup> Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, *there* is liberty. <sup>18</sup> But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit.
