1. A child's need

- a. As Christians, we embrace two realities:
 - i. Everyone is made in God's image
 - ii. All of us are broken, fallen, damaged
- b. Two considerations
 - i. Centuries
 - 1. The devil was in the 1st century, and is still around in 21st
 - 2. The devil may change tactics, but mission is the same
 - ii. Dimensions
 - 1. We are body, mind, and spirit. A complexity of interconnections
 - 2. Our bodies are broken; the spiritual battle is real
 - 3. We must stand firm in the faith

2. A father's faith

- a. An exhausted father
- b. "Teacher, I brought my son to you..."
- c. "O faithless generation...Bring him to me."
- d. A father's shame
 - i. John 9: "Who sinned? Whose fault is it?"
 - ii. Exodus 4: "Who makes himblind? Is it not I, the Lord?"
- e. A Good Shepherd's care
- f. A father's plea: "Have compassion on us..."
- g. Jesus' ministry was the inauguration of His Kingdom, not the consummation. "We do not yet see all things subject to Christ."
- h. A father's healing

- a. The disciples failures led them to guestion themselves
- b. This kind only driven out by prayer
 - i. Prayer is a lifestyle
 - ii. Prayer is dependency on God
 - iii. Prayer is abiding in Christ
