## A Brief History of Slavery

- 1. 3 Defining Characteristics of Slavery: A human being is another's property, their will is subject to another's authority, & labor is obtained by another's coercion (Rom. 6:15-23).
- 2. In the Beginning it was Not so (Genesis): Born free, Bound & Sold (Joseph)
- 3. God Sets Israel Free From Bondage (Exodus)
- 4. 1st Century AD 1 out of 3 persons in Rome and 1 out of 5 elsewhere was a slave
- 5. Slavery was almost Universal: Members of every Nation & Tribe Enslaved & had been Enslaved (Story of Spartacus)
- 6. Jesus & the Apostles laid the Groundwork for Slavery Everywhere to be Undermined & for the Slave as our Fellow Sibling to be Valued & Freed
- 7. The Messianic Promise to 'Proclaim Liberty to the Captives' (Isaiah 61:1) Takes Time to Sink into Hearts & be Honored In Cultures
