Titus 1:10-11 Review: UnChristian "Christians"—How They Talk

How UnChristian "Christians" Walk

- Truth & Falsehood is Central to This Passage: You Walk in Light of What You Believe & You Believe What is Either True or False
- Sin Can Be Seen From Within & From Outside a Culture (1:12-13)
- 1. "Always Liars" They Walk In Lies, Making Lying a Lifestyle & a Full Time Job
- 2. "Evil Beasts" They Walk More Like Selfish Animals Than Like Image Bearers
- 3. "Lazy Gluttons" They Walk Only to Feed Themselves & Not Feed Others
- 4. "Devoted to Jewish Myths" They Go Beyond Truth Until They are Living for Lies
- 5. "Devoted to...the commands of people who turn away from the truth" They Turn Away from The Truth to Follow People

Why It Matters?

- These 3 C's Matter: 1. Culture, 2. Christ, 3. Confrontation
- 1. **Culture**: All Places & People Have a Culture A Mixture of Godless & Godly
- 2. **Christ**: Christ Jesus is at Work Reconciling Sinners to God & to One Another
- 3. **Confrontation**: The Heart of Confrontation: "Rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith."
 - When Confronted Do We Hear Christ?
 - When Confronting Culture Do We Speak Christ?

What To Do?

- 1. Admit Cultural Practices can Enter the Church for Good or for III
- 2. Understand that if You Love a Culture there are Things You Will Want To Change in the Culture
- 3. We Must Wisely & Lovingly Confront because We Care about Culture



Only Christ Our Redeemer Can Help Us Redeem A Culture the Right Way
