#### What to Focus On In Controversial Times?

- 1. Focus on the Gospel In Controversial Times (3:3-7)
- 2. Focus on Connecting What You Believe God Has Done for You With What You are Doing (3:3-8)
- 3. Focus on Carefully Devoting Yourself to Good Works (3:8)
- 4. Confront the Culture by Believing & Living the Gospel (3:1-8)
  - Why? These Things are Excellent & Profitable for People (3:8)

### What To Avoid In Controversial Times (3:9)

- 1. Avoid Foolish Controversies (Fighting Foolishly)
- 2. Avoid Genealogies (Boasting in Race & Tribe)
- 3. Avoid Dissensions (Debating Based on Rivalry, Position & Power, Not Based on Substance & Truth)
- 4. Avoid Quarrels About the Law (Legal Disputes that Divide But Do Not Serve a Greater Purpose)
  - Why? Some Controversies are Unprofitable & Worthless

## What To Do When a Person is Divisive & Controversial (In Church) (3:10-11)

- Warn Once
- 2. Warn Twice
- 3. Have Nothing More to Do With the Person
  - Why? Some People are Warped, Sinful & Self-Condemned

- 4. Consider Titus 3:10-11. At first reading it can sound harsh. How can a church community live these instructions in a loving way? Why is it sometimes loving to dodge a debate rather than engage in more debate? What wisdom from God's Word helps us decided when to press into a controversy and when to dodge cul-de-sac's of controversy?
