- 2. Just Because You Know Something Doesn't Make It Easier; Knowing Something Often Makes it Harder
- 3. Rightly Knowing Leads to Real Sacrificial Love
- 4. Rightly Knowing Christ Leads to Trusting His Sacrificial Love
