FAILURE OF GOD'S ANOINTED

PSALM 3-41

Psalm 3 "A Psalm of David, when he fled from Absalom his son".

Psalm 3:3, "But you O Lord are a shield about me, my glory, and the lifter of my head"

Psalm 10:1–2 [1] "Why, O LORD, do you stand far away? Why do you hide yourself in times of trouble?
[2] In arrogance the wicked hotly pursue the poor; let them be caught in the schemes that they have devised."

HUMANITY SINCE THE FALL

Psalm 14:1–3 The Fool Says, There Is No God To the choirmaster. Of David.

• [1] The fool says in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, they do abominable deeds; there is none who does good. [2] The LORD looks down from heaven on the children of man, to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God. [3] They have all turned aside; together they have become corrupt; there is none who does good, not even one. (ESV)

DAVIDIC RULE EXTENDED TO THE NATIONS

SCOTT ANIOL

"Psalm 49 is a summons to the nations: "Hear this, all peoples! Give ear, all inhabitants of the world" (v 1). Likewise, Psalm 50 is a summons specifically to God's people, those "who made a covenant with me by sacrifice," calling all to submit to God as judge (50:5). In response to this summons, God's Anointed himself answers and confesses his sin to God (Ps 51), submitting his rule to Yahweh's rule. Likewise the pagan king Doeg the Edomite answers God's summons (Ps 52)."
