#### GETTING TO KNOW YOU

### **QUICK REVIEW**

#### MAIN POINT

The word of God is a powerful "sword" that helps us experience victory in spiritual battles but needs to be used properly to see its benefit.

### DIGGING INTO THE WORD

- What makes a sharp knife or scissors valuable?
- How can the word of God be like a sharp knife or scissors?

The word of God – LOGOS = the whole truth of God
The word of God – RHEMA = the whole truth of God - SPOKEN

• What happens if a person knows a lot about the Bible but never speaks the truth of God into other people's lives?

#### READ - Hebrews 4:12

- What does this verse claim the word of God is able to do?
- What do you think it means that the word of God divides between soul and spirit, joint and marrow?

- Share a time in your life when the word of God cut you to the heart.
- How can understanding the power of the word of the God help us to realize that sharing it is a great privilege rather than a strict command?
- How can the word of God help us overcome spiritual attacks/temptations?
- Can you share a time in your life when the word of God helped you defeat the attacks of the enemy?

#### **READ - John 14:26**

- What is the comforting promise Jesus gives us regarding how we will be able to remember the word of God?
- What is necessary for us to do for the above 2 verses to be able to take place?
- Share how the word of God has been a blessing in your life.
