

Group Questions – Joshua 10-12 – That’s Impossible

Share a time when you faced something overwhelming.

What were your thoughts and emotions as you looked at that situation?

Pastor Nate shared that the Israelites had only defeated 2 of more than 20 armies that they would need to defeat.

In what way could that understanding create fear or discouragement?

Read – Joshua 10:1-7

Pastor Nate shared that Joshua had created a problem for himself by making a treaty with the Gibeonites that he never should have made.

Can you share a time in your life when you created a problem for yourself?

Even though Joshua created this problem, listen to what God says...

Read – Joshua 10:8

What does this show you regarding the problems you create for yourself?

Though God promised to help, still, they were facing 5 armies at once... something they had never encountered before.

Read – Isaiah 41:10

What does God promise in this verse?

Though God promises to help us, still, we sometimes face things we have never encountered before.

What causes us to forget God’s promise to us in those times?

What does it mean to you to TRUST GOD?

If we only trust God with the small things, are we truly trusting God?

Read – Joshua 10:9-15

God gave them the victory, but they had to fight the “impossible” battle.

How does that fact relate to us facing impossible things in our lives?

Joshua prayed for the sun to stand still and it did.

Why do you think Joshua asked God to do something impossible?

What do you think made it possible for Joshua to pray this prayer?

Why do we struggle to ask God to do the impossible?

Read – Matthew 19:26

Is there anything you are currently facing that seems impossible?

Read – Isaiah 40:25-26 and Colossians 1:17

What do these verses say regarding how big God is?

Is YOUR God the same size as the God described in scripture?

What causes us to make God smaller than He truly is?

How big is your impossible problem compared to the one true God?

Close in prayer asking God to help you with the impossible.
