

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths." Proverbs 3:5-6

I grew up in Corsica, South Dakota, a small town just southwest of Mitchell. From there it was just a few hours out to the Black Hills, which would often be our summer vacation destination. I love it out there with its beauty, its wildlife, its history, and all the fun sights to see – Mount Rushmore, Bear Country, Reptile Gardens, and Custer State Park, just to name a few.

One of the best ways to see the beauty of this area is to travel on the Peter Norbeck Scenic Byway. Now, if you were just trying to get through the Black Hills on your travels farther west, this would not be the recommended route. You would stay on the Interstate or one of the main highways that would be much straighter and the quickest way to get from Point A to Point B. Because, if you have been on the Scenic Byway you know it is full of pigtail bridges, single lane tunnels, twists, and turns that all disrupt the flow of traffic and cause you to slow down.

When I have been on that Byway as an adult in the recent years, you get a very different perspective. No longer just sitting back and enjoying the view of the trees, the rocks, and hopefully an elk or buffalo along the way. But now, I was now the one driving, paying attention to the road. Watching out for the twists and turns that come out of nowhere and making sure to stay clear of the edge of the cliff we were driving along. This road suddenly became a bit more frightening and caused some anxiety.

This road can sometimes be a perfect metaphor for our life. We think we are on the highway, the perfect path, going through life without much care or worry, and then suddenly something happens that makes us feel like we are on a Scenic Byway. Life throws a bunch of twists and turns at us, and we can no longer see the horizon or the ending, but are just caught up in the chaos of life. At times this can be beautiful and wonderful, while other times it can be completely terrifying, like we are hanging on the edge of a cliff.

We all experience these moments in life. Where it just seems like everything is out of our control and we cannot figure out what the future holds. Which brings me to the verses from Proverbs printed above that call for us to "trust in the Lord with all your heart."

God never promises a life without twists and turns, a life free from fear or worry or stress. However, God does promise to ALWAYS be with us. God promises to be with us as we go through this life, to help us navigate those tumultuous times and guide us back to a place where the path seem straight again.

If you are feeling a little lost or in a period of life surrounded by chaos, I encourage you to place your trust in the Lord. To find someone to pray with you and help you share your burdens with God. Knowing that God will be there to listen, to guide, to comfort you along the way. May the peace of God which passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Church on the Street—an ELCA Mission in Sioux Falls

Whether we are out on the streets, visiting with a congregation, or at a meeting of people who gather to discuss services that are already providing for the marginalized homeless community, the question we are asked most often is, "Why?" Why don't you just invite everyone to church and call it good? This might work for some. But others need more. We introduce ourselves, listen to their entire life story, share kind words about how happy we are to have met them, and then invite them to join us in Ministry.

We don't ask the unhoused to come to a worshiping community where they may not be able to read the bulletin or be uncomfortable about how long it has been since they have had a shower. We don't ask them to put money into a basket because we know their pockets are light and they need the money they have to live. We don't expect them to know when to stand, what to say when they "share the peace" or make small talk after worship. We expect none of these things. Church on the Street's expectation is solely with the Holy Spirit. The work being done is The Holy Spirit surrounding us with compassion, acceptance, and understanding that whatever has or will happen, they are whole and loved by God, through us, his disciples.

Although we are a Church without walls, we are sturdy. Church on the Street moves to suit the needs of the people. After all, the people are the Church. As we are out on the streets sharing the Good News, we feel so much support from the Greater Church of the ELCA and local congregations who are asking why, spreading the word, and inviting their congregations to be a part of this powerful Ministry.

As Church on the Street is a Synodically Authorized Worshiping Community (SAWC) of the ELCA, we will continue to carry out Christ's Great Commission by reaching out to ALL people to bring them to faith in Christ. Please, take a moment, say a prayer, answer your own WHY and then join us in this amazing Ministry!

THANK YOU for sending your rostered leaders and voting members to the 2023 synod assembly. Almost 400 people gathered under the theme of "Cultivate" with a focus on rural ministry.

Our two keynote speakers, Rev. Mark Yackel-Juleen from Wartburg Seminary and Rev. Jon Anderson from Luther Seminary, shared hard facts and data as well as hope and future vision.

Did you know that Region 3, Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota, are the largest region in the ELCA? Did you know that 75% of the members of the ELCA live in rural communities? And did you know that the average worship attendance across the ELCA is 50-75 people?

Once the synod assembly concluded on Saturday, he took off with our Rural Ministry Liaison, Pastor Alan Blankenfeld, and Kathy McHenry from Lutheran Planned Generosity to experience rural South Dakota.

I know that he enjoyed his experience, both at the assembly as well as the tutoring from the synod, because he said so. It has sharpened his understanding of rural ministry and our place in the life and ministry of the ELCA.

Thank you, South Dakota Synod, for your hospitality, your welcome, and for your ministry. I pray for adequate moisture, farm and ranch safety, energy as you plan for fall ministry, and fun and growth during your summer ministry programming.


