When was the last time you thought about the ten commandments? Was it confirmation? Was it last Sunday while keeping it holy? Can you remember them all?

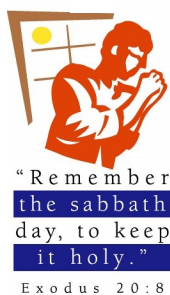
Confirmation has been discussing The Ten Commandments and Pastor Justin found some fun ways to teach them. Let's do a quick review of most the Commandments.



1) No other Gods before me. It's number one, but I also think it's the hardest! Okay, sure it's easy not to worship a golden calf, but think of all the things we let come between our relationship with God. I'll share a few I struggle with. Do you struggle with these things? Money, travel, work, family, love for our nation, television, sports and even nature.



2) Don't use the Lord's name in Vain! This is hard but should be easy, especially when I am enjoying some of my favorite things like watching a good show, reading a good book, or watching a sports team! I need a constant reminder. No OH MY ___! here. It's just getting harder and harder in our world. Just as God made each of us and our names unique, his name is also important and requires respect. Let the time we use his name be for praise and worship!



3) Remember the Sabbath Day! Wait...this one is hard as well. I am a busy person, busy people hardly have time to rest. Just like our body needs to be restored at night to prepare for the next day or week, our soul needs to rest too! 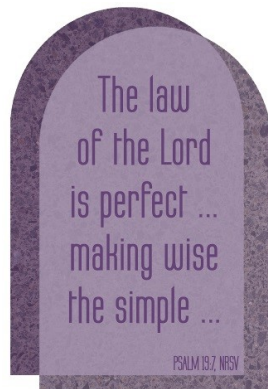

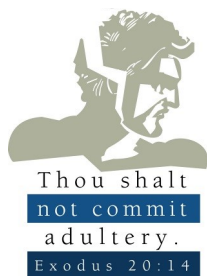

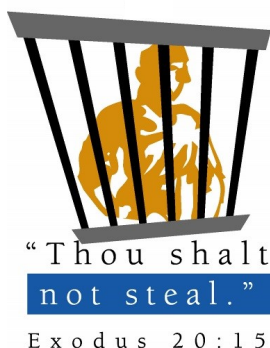


6) Do not commit adultery. Remember those vows you placed on your wedding day to stay committed, but also remember the vow to humankind to love one another. "The greatest is love."
