After the heat of the summer, the cool evenings and mornings offer a freshness in the air and an opportunity to grab those comfy sweatshirts. Sunday afternoon football has been a tradition in my life since I was little. Each fall reminds me of those Sundays when we would get home from church, throw the blanket down on the living floor (so we wouldn't spill on the carpet), and each our dinner watching the Vikings. Fall also brings about the season of harvest. That long awaited time when you get to discover what developed from those tiny seeds that were put in the ground back in the spring. We often look at this parable from the perspective of our own hearts – what kind of soil do we have ready to receive the seeds of God's love in our lives. God being the sower who is generously shares His love with the world. This is an appropriate interpretation and offers us something to reflect on in our own lives.

But what happens if we view ourselves as the farmer? Are we generously sowing the seeds of God's love in our lives? We often talk about planting seeds of faith in our children's lives through Sunday School. Continuing to give them nuggets of faith and knowledge of God's love for them, hoping one day they will grow into a strong and faithful member of God's church. But as we have been reflecting on in worship and as our Mission Statement says, we are all people growing in faith. Again – as the harvest reminds us each fall – there is no harvest without the planting of seeds.

In what ways are you sharing your time, talent, and treasures with those around you – children and adults alike? What are the ways you can generously share God's love and plant seeds of faith in others? How have the seeds other people have planted in our lives helped us to grow in our own faith?

As you witness the harvest this fall season, may it remind you of the seeds that were planted and the seeds that God has given to you to plant in this world around us!
