

Joann Volkenant shared the following story/devotion with me this past month. It was so powerful, that I shared it at our last council meeting as our closing devotion. They also were moved by it, which led me to wanting to share it with the whole congregation.

I think the message is especially appropriate this time of year. As I write this, we just finished up our last Wednesday Lenten evening filled with supper, activities for the kids, and worship. We are looking ahead to the busy days of Holy Week in the church. Every once in a while, with all that activity, the thoughts of the wear and tear on our church, the mess the kids might be making as they are running around between supper and worship, or the mud being dragged in along with the snow can creep into our minds. We might get tempted to get grumpy or worried about the state of the church or the carpet.

May this devotion help give you a different perspective if those thoughts ever tempt your mind.

After everyone had left the church this morning, I noticed one of our dads stayed behind. "Do you need some help?" I asked him as I walked up behind him. "Oh no, Father. I just saw how dirty the floor was in the church after Masses, so I thought I'd sweep." He was going under every chair and kneeler carefully. I saw a huge pile of dirt at the end of the row that he had collected. As I looked around, he had collected several enormous piles of dirt and grass already. "It's amazing how dirty the floor gets in one weekend. Our volunteers cleaned on Friday. Look how much you have already swept!" I said. "You know, Father, I think this is wonderful. As I'm sweeping under each chair, I'm thanking God that someone was sitting in it this weekend. All the dirt I see is because someone came to church today. I love seeing how dirty this floor is." "You're right," I said. "If we wanted a clean church, we wouldn't let people inside. I hope everyone thinks the way you do. When a house is messy, it's because people live inside it. When the dishes need to be washed, it's because people ate together." "Father, sweeping this floor today makes me excited to go home and see my wife. I can't wait to tell her that I'm happy even when our house is a little messy. It means someone lives there. My wife and my kids and me are there. I'd rather us be together than have a perfectly clean house with no one inside," he replied. "And that's how I think Jesus feels about the Church. He'd rather us be here and get it a little messy than have it sparkling and empty." "Thanks, Father. I'm going to keep sweeping and praying for each person who came through this weekend." As I walked away, I smiled and said a prayer of thanksgiving. Thank you, Lord, for the dirt on your floor.

I too am thankful for the dirt on our floor, for the dumpster overflowing with trash, for the mint jar that seems to always need refilling, for a church full of faithful worshippers, and for the wonderful noise of joyful children!



You are invited to bring some seeds and/or soil of your own to be included in the blessing.







We are very thankful for their time.


A little basketball was part of the children's activities on a Wednesday Lenten Night.








