

Now you might be thinking—

"This is the December newsletter I am reading, right?
What is this Happy New Year graphic doing here?"

This month we mark the beginning of a New Church Year—The Liturgical Calendar that guides us as we worship and helps us retell the story of our Savior, Jesus Christ each year.

Each new Church Year begins with the Season of Advent. These 4 weeks we are in right now, where we are waiting and anticipating the coming of the Christ Child. Advent means "coming." That is followed, of course, by Christmas!

Unlike the rest of the world, who moves on from Christmas by December 26th, for us December 24th is just the beginning of the Christmas Season. In the Church, we celebrate Christmas for 12 days (cue the song) until Epiphany on January 6th.

Epiphany means to make known and this Season in January and February celebrates Christ being made known to the people. We read stories of the Wise Men coming to worship the King, of Jesus' Baptism, and some of His first miracles where it is revealed to the world that He is truly God's Son.

Following Epiphany, we move into the Season of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday. Lent reminds us of Christ's sacrifice and prepares us to hear again the Passion Story of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. Lent ends with the greatest celebration in the Church Year—the celebration of Easter and Christ victory over sin and death as we retell the resurrection story. Following seven weeks of Easter celebrations we close the first half of the Church Year with Pentecost Sunday and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The second half of the Church Year is marked as the Season after Pentecost, running from around the end of May until the end of November. This season is focused on our growth as God's people, marked with the color green adorning the altar and pulpit. We have heard the story again of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection and have been filled with the Holy Spirit. Now we focus on what it means to live as God's people in the world and as Christ' disciples.

The Church Year ends with the celebration of Christ the King Sunday as we foretell the story of Christ returning to serve as King over His eternal kingdom.

I love the foundation that our Liturgical Year gives us as we gather to worship and live as a community of faith.

It provides us the guidance that helps us remember all that God has done for us through Jesus Christ and calls us to faithful living in our everyday lives.

I do wish you a Happy New Year as we begin this new Liturgical Year and invite you to join with me as we journey through this year learning and growing together as the Church!
