Ruth: Chapter 3

Glorifying God in the Mundane: Wisdom, Obedience, and Mercy.

In the Hebrew Bible (our Old Testament), they placed Ruth right after the book of Proverbs. She was a woman who lived in the difficult times of the Judges. At this time there was much war and famine. Ruth stands up during difficult times and does what is right, much like the Proverbs 31 woman. She is not a hero in the worldly sense, but is a righteous woman who glorified God in the mundane of working the fields.

As we read through chapter 3, can you see Ruth exhibiting the traits of a person who has already been redeemed by God?

SCHOOL: THE BOOK OF RUTH

How could a person who has received God's mercy not exhibit His righteousness for His glory?

Ruth, in this chapter, will obey the wisdom of Naomi and seek a redeemer in Boaz. A redeemer is a male relative that will marry the widow of his brother. The relative redeems the widow and the land is given to their first born along with the name of the deceased brother. The redeemer's role is very sacrificial because he gains nothing monetarily and loses his first son in the marriage to another name.

How does Boaz reflect the life of someone who has been redeemed by God?
