Luke 22:47-53

In the Garden of Gethsemane is where we find the great betrayal of Judas Iscariot. The characters mentioned in this account are characters that have been active throughout Passion Week.

Although historical literature is quite aggressive in the way it describes Judas Iscariot, the Gospels simply call him "one of the 12." Do you see how impactful that is? Jesus was betrayed by an insider, not an outsider.

A few descriptions of our crowd:

1. <u>Unjust:</u> Jesus didn't commit any crime against God, man, Judaism or Caesar.

- 2. **Mindless:** Jesus healed the sick, fed the poor, cast out demons, raised the dead, and taught truths about God's Kingdom.
- 3. **Cowardly:** They come fully armed and ready to cease this humble Galilean who is unarmed and undefended.

The loyalty of the disciples is special. But in a few moments they will flee and Peter will deny Him. Can you think of moments in your walk when you know that you've disappointed God? Do you find comfort in the knowledge that all of Christ's followers are fully forgiven and will always be restored?

The disciples' failure to WATCH AND PRAY led to their inability to COPE WITH THEIR TRIALS. Have you seen this to be true in your life?
