Philippians 3:12-16

A part of the beauty of the gospel is realizing that our hope is in the future glory of Christ, not in whatever our past has looked like. And Paul reminds the church of the hope that we are moving toward.

Of all that we count as gain, what is the prize of the gospel?
How is it obtained?

Paul reminds the church that his future hope hasn't yet been obtained and that his current life in the flesh hasn't yet been perfected. How does this theology line up with our understanding of the salvific truths of sanctification and glorification?

How does our understanding of righteousness change when we, like Paul, can say "Christ Jesus has made me his own"?

What constitutes a "mature" Christian, according to Paul? And why does the way we "think" reveal this?

What language does Paul use in this text that shows the sovereign work of God in salvation?
