Philippians 4:20-23

Paul concludes his letter to the Philippians by offering edifying words of reminder to the Christians in the church. These include characteristics that set them apart as saints in the church of Christ.

What is our definition of "doxology?" How is this helpful to know as we sing one every Sunday?

Paul calls the Christians "saints" in our text. What is our working definition of "saint?" Do you understand the grace of God in Him "setting you apart?"

God is holy, so saints are holy. Is this hard to reconcile in your heart? Why? How are we made holy?

True worship flows from revealed divine truth.

What are characteristics of Christian worship? Who is the object? How is it shaped by the intimate relationship we have with our heavenly Father?

The church is to be unified! How do we find this most challenging in the church today? Why is the fellowship of the saints such a gift for us to experience?

Paul includes the household of Caesar as apart of the saints in Rome. How is personal evangelism reflected in your life? Do you rejoice in lost sinners coming to faith?
