Acts 19:21-41

John Calvin said the heart of every man is an idol factory. We are craftsman, creating for ourselves idols as substitutes for the living God. Our text will show this to be true in Ephesus.

Most of what we consider to be idols are good and right things but are misplaced in the realm where only God should exist. Can you give examples of common idols of the heart? What are idols that you've struggled to put in their proper place?

The gospel exposes false religion, as it does in Ephesus. Do you have examples of where the gospel has exposed moral discrepancies in your life? Can you think of ways the gospel exposed your pursuit of creating idols that were misplaced?

The teachings of Scripture will change religious alignments, cultural familiarities, and economic convictions, such as we see in Ephesus.

Can you give examples of how the gospel changed your religious alignments, cultural familiarities, and economic convictions?

Paul wanted to defend the honor of the Lord and His gospel but his friends protected him. He could live to fight another day. How is this sometimes practical advice played out in our day?
