## Acts 21:17-26

Of the many wonderful characteristics that we've learned about the Apostle Paul, one stands out as the most impactful: his humility. Paul continues to walk in humility for the expansion of the gospel.

Paul has a lot to boast about. He says so much in Galatians 1:14, Philippians 3:4-6, and 2nd Corinthians 11:21-28. But how do these reasons for boasting turn into examples of humility?

Are there areas of your life that you find yourself exhibiting pride in? Are there areas you find difficult to find humility in?

There are several ways Paul shows humility in our text:

- 1. In his boasting of the Lord in his successful ministry
- 2. In his willingness to receive criticism, even when it was misinformed
- 3. In his willingness to make sacrificial moves that weren't required of him through his freedom in Christ.

Are there things that you've sacrificed for the unity of a weaker brother or sister? What are they?

Do you find it challenging to give up your Christian liberty because somebody has offense to it? Are there times when you shouldn't give up those liberties?

Gospel unity is hard to accomplish because it requires humble care by people who aren't perfect.
